Nursery Build


The nursery building is almost complete however given the current national lockdown it isn't open for staff or families yet.

School Closure and Parental Feedback on Remote Learning

In line with guidelines Cross Arthurlie is currently closed to almost all children. From the 5th January staff organised remote learning packs and have been delivering on-line learning for most children since then.

Letters were issued to parents outlining the format the remote learning would take with a subsequent policy being issued.

At the end of the first two weeks of full remote learning a questionnaire was issued to parents around how they were finding remote learning. A total of 104 returns were received, which is more than any other survey we have issued.





4. Does you child find the work





5. Do we have the right balance of activities?






6. Does your child find the daily Google Meets helpful?







The Google Meets have been very successful and staff and children are getting used to the routine of these. The comments received were very positive with families recognising the work that staff are undertaking to ensure that children are as well supported as possible during these difficult times. As a result of the questionnaire all work for children is posted the night before on their Google Classroom. Members of the SMT are catching up with individual parents to offer support or clarify issues as they arise.

All staff are part of 'bubbles' and work across stages either in school or on-line. It is really important that we ensure the number of people in the building is minimised. There are currently 56 children attending school who are either classed as vulnerable or whose parents are Key Workers, not working from home, and have no alternative childcare. Most of the children attending school do so on a part time basis. 56 is approximately 18% or the school roll which is higher than the ERC average of 10%.
