Staffing

Mrs Webster will be retiring at the end of term. Her post will hopefully be recruited before the end of term. Our staffing allocation has not been completely finalised which means classes haven't been allocated to teachers yet. We are likely to have 14 classes again in session 2024-2025. This will be in place before the end of term with children having the opportunity to meet their new teacher on Tuesday 18th June.

## Budget

The impact of the budget savings which were previously agreed by council for session 2024-25 are now being implemented. This includes an increase to  $\pounds 2.50$  for school meals for children in P6& 7 who are not entitled to free school meals.

# Curriculum

We have fully implemented our new languages programme with French being taught across the school and within the nursery to a high standard. We are continuing to look for more opportunities to take learning outdoors and both staff and children are continuing to explore relevant and meaningful ways to learn outside. We have made progress with science and all teachers have developed their teaching of science.

We have made progress in ensuring that children are more actively involved in designing the curriculum. This will continue to next year.

### Learning and Teaching

Staff have adapted their teaching to accommodate a range of different ways children learn. Both Education Scotland and East Renfrewshire Council are conscious of the specific supports for children who are care experienced. As part of this, as a whole staff team we will be undertaking training throughout next session on 'The Promise'.

We will also be working with other teachers across ERC to ensure that our classrooms and learning spaces are appropriate to the needs of all children using a

resource promoted by Education Scotland 'Circle'. We have already looked at aspects of this and it will be good to build on this work next session.
