## Learning Intentions:

To discover how a camera works

To create an image using technology and a camera

To use my knowledge gained to select different materials and textures in order to create a piece of visual art work from a photograph.

## Success Criteria:

I can take a photograph using a camera

I can use different materials to recreate a photograph; I have taken.

I can explore the environment to take photos of a specific object or person as my inspiration

I can use different materials to create an art form.

Briefly outline the context and range of quality learning experiences that have been provided making reference to the chosen design principles.

Using digital cameras to take a variety photographs of the environment inside and outside. From these photographs the children then decide which ones they would like to print, to use as their 'inspiration' for their art work.

The art work is made from various materials and textures in order for the children to have personalisation and choice meeting their individual preferences and for the children to take ownership of their work.

The children learn to frame their art pieces and decorate their frames, to present their art piece at the Art Gallery at the end of the block.

#### Follow up

The children learn the relevance of taking the photographs and making their art work by having an Art Gallery at the end of the block, to show off their work.

The children become their own curators for their Art Gallery telling the adults about the photographs they have taken and the inspiration for their art pieces.

They also sell their art work to raise funds for the nursery and the school, and they have been interviewed previously for a brochure that they sell at the Art Gallery, stating their artist name, biography, the inspiration for their art work and what they have called their piece.

<u>Say</u> – Comments from the child on his photo (in brochure page attached) about his inspiration for his art work coming from the environment and the materials that he had used.
