Briefly outline the context and range of quality learning experiences that have been provided making reference to the chosen design principles.

Lesson 1 – Research Task About A Roman Emperor - *SOC* 1-03a, LIT 1-25a During the lesson pupils will research a Roman Emperor (Hadrian, Julius Caesar, Nero or Augustus). Pupils will be given a sheet with headings to help them to structure their notes. Pupils will discuss their findings, sharing facts about the Emperor.

Lesson 2 –Planning a leaflet LIT 1-24a, LIT 1-25a

During the lesson pupils will plan a leaflet in their writing jotters, pupils will be encouraged to use their notes from lesson 1 to write about their chosen emperor. Pupils will write under subheadings.

Lesson 3 - Writing a leaflet about a Roman Emperor - LIT 1-24a, LIT 1-25a

During the lesson pupils will complete a leaflet using a template and their plan. Pupils will then draw illustrations which are appropriate to the topic they have written about.

- recording and presenting thinking in different ways (creating notes, using notes and writing for leaflet)
- evaluating learning and identifying possible next steps.

Lesson 1 - The child was praised for finding facts about the roman emperor. While he was reading he was encouraged to take time to think about the facts and record some under the correct headings. He was then able to contribute to a discussion about his findings and was given verbal feedback.

Lesson 2 - See written feedback

Lesson 3 – the child evaluated his work through discussion with class teacher

Next steps – to choose own heading for research and leaflet, to complete research using a wider range of sources.


