- 1. A variety of stories, picture books and videos to support the concept caring for the environment.
- 2. Interactive lesson using ICT introduced the idea of Reduce, Reuse, Recycle
- 3. Class discussion about ways we can be more eco-friendly in classrooms and development of a survey.
- 4. Pupils complete survey on eco-friendly classrooms.
- 5. Analysis of survey results and class discussion on next steps
- 6. Mind map of why it is important to care for environment
- 7. Introduction to persuasive writing lesson
- 8. Comparing persuasive and non-persuasive letters.

- 9. Discuss ways in which we can care for the environment at the school to prepare for writing the letter. (Evidence SAY. LI 2)
- 10. Write a letter to the class teachers involved in the survey to encourage them to care for the environment. (Evidence WRITE. LI)

Briefly outline the oral/written feedback given to the pupil on progress and next steps, referring to the learning intention and success criteria.

At all points in the process, there was oral feedback to the pupil. Encouragement on their progress and suggestions of next steps.

Specifically, after completing the mind map with her group, the pupil and her group presented their mind map to the rest of the class. After all groups had presented their mind maps, a discussion ensued on the most persuasive reasons for the classes to care for the environment.

After the pupil had had input on persuasive letter writing techniques, there was a refresher discussion about how we can care for the environment at our school. There was oral feedback on the results of this discussion, teasing out points which may have been forgotten and emphasising points that were most important. The pupil was told that the next step would be to use these important arguments in a persuasive letter to a class teacher to make sure the other classes in the school were as environmentally friendly as possible.

The feedback for the persuasive letter consisted of two stars and a wish which related back to the success criteria for the letter. Oral feedback was given during the writing process to remind the child (and the rest of the class!) to read over their work to make sure it made sense. All children self-assessed their writing using the success criteria.

Pupil Voice:

What have you learned? How did you learn? What skills have you developed? I have learned that you need to switch off electricity – I told my mum that she needed to switch off the lights at home. You need to do this so you don't waste energy. Also if we use too much electricity it makes lots of CO2 gases which is not good for the atmosphere and not good for our breathing.

I learned this by checking if the lights were off and boards were off in other classrooms then discussing with a group how the class could be more eco-friendly. We also played games on the computer to learn about the environment.

I can write a letter to an adult to persuade them to do something. I am getting better at reading over my writing to make sure it makes sense.


