Briefly outline the context and range of quality learning experiences that have been provided making reference to the chosen design principles.

A child brought in leaves he collected when walking to the nursery with his parent. The child gave them to his keyworker and asked 'why do leaves fall on the ground' This sparked and interest in leaves, and a discussion took place with the child and a group of children, who were eager to know more about the leaves the child brought into nursery. The keyworker then planned with the child what he could do with the leaves giving him autonomy within his learning and share his experience. During daily discussions and planning a range of learning experiences were planned and delivered within the playroom, outdoor area and the local area.

The children were involved in choosing a range of books for the story corner to find information to further develop their knowledge about seasons and autumn and talk about the changes in trees. Spontaneous discussion also took place about various animals and how they get ready for autumn. The children went outdoors to explore the area and found leaves, acorns, chestnuts and pine cones. They used a variety of materials to build a hedgehogs den. The art and craft area was used for leaf rubbings, collage and to make an autumn display. The interactive whiteboard was used for songs, games and video on the sequence of autumn.

Briefly outline the oral/written feedback given to the pupil on progress and next steps, referring to the learning intention and success criteria.

Throughout this experience, the child was given praise for the progress he had made in being confident to ask questions and finding out information about autumn. He was encouraged and happy to share his knowledge of the changes of autumn, the weather being colder and why the leaves fall off the tree with the other children at small and large group time. He was very enthusiastic to show and tell his mum what he has had been making, what he has been learning about and the pieces of work he has put into his learning profile.

<u>Next Step</u>: continue to provide opportunities for the child to further research information about other season and how these affect the environment, using a variety of media to extend his prior knowledge of the changes in autumn.

Next Step/home link: Staff highlighted to the parents about his knowledge and interest in autumn. They were very happy to support his interest at home by going on walks to the local park and talking to him about the changes.

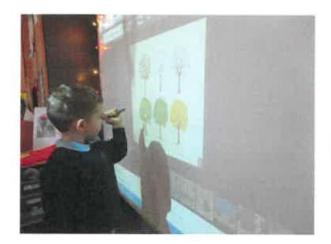

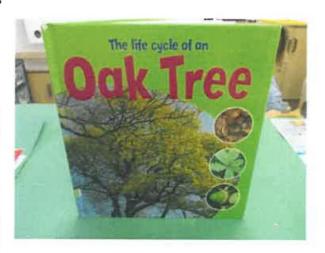
