Lesson 1: Breadth

Explore the purpose of different texts.

Pupils will read a variety of extracts in pairs and identify why the text has been written and who the intended audience is.

Lesson 2: Application

Exploring the purpose of texts and identify the main idea of each paragraph.

Pupils will identify the purpose and intended audience of the text.

Pupils will highlight key words in each paragraph to identify the main idea. Pupils will discuss their answers in groups of 4.

Lesson 3: Application, Challenge

Pupils will read Christmas passage in mixed ability pairs and identify the purpose of the text.

Pupils will highlight the key words in each paragraph to identify the main idea.

Teacher will assess note taking to assess Reading LI using Success Criteria (See teacher observation assessment sheet). Pupils will share their ideas and opinions of the Christmas traditions in groups of 4, using gestures to agree and disagree.

Teacher will observe to assess Listening and Talking LI and RME LI using Success Criteria (See teacher observation assessment sheet).

If you looked at the moon this weekend it might have seemed bigger and brighter than usual.

That's because it was a supermoon!

For it to be called that two things have to happen.

It has to be a full moon and it has to be closer to the Earth than normal.

The moon doesn't move around our planet in a circle - it orbits in an oval shape.

This means at certain times it's nearer and it looks bigger.

It was around 222,761 miles from Earth, closer than its average 238,900 miles.

December's full moon is traditionally known as the Cold Moon.

The exact moment of the full moon was at 3:47pm on Sunday 3 December when it sat opposite the sun in the sky.

Unlike the sun, it's safe to look directly at the moon and you can use a telescope or binoculars.

Mince Pies

This crumbly, fruity mince pie recipe is a Christmas classic.

Ingredients

- 350g/12oz high quality mincemeat, preferably homemade
- 200g/7oz <u>plain flour</u>, sifted
- 40g/1½oz golden <u>caster sugar</u>
- 75g/2¾oz ground almonds
- 125g/4½oz unsalted <u>butter</u>, diced
- 1 large free-range egg, beaten
- milk, to glaze



Method

- 1. Lightly butter a 12-hole pie or patty tin. Tip the mincemeat into a bowl and stir so that the liquid is evenly distributed.
- 2. Place the flour, sugar, almonds and butter in a food processor and process briefly until resembling breadcrumbs, then slowly add the egg through the feeder tube. (Or rub the butter into the dry ingredients by hand and stir in the egg.)
- 3. Bring the mixture together with your hands, wrap in clingfilm and chill for an hour or so. Thinly roll out the pastry on a floured surface. Cut out 12 circles with a fluted pastry cutter, large enough to fill the base of the prepared tin. Press gently into each hole, then fill with the mincemeat.
- 4. Cut out another 12 slightly smaller discs and use to cover the mincemeat. Press the edges together to seal. Make a small slit in the top of each, then brush lightly with milk. Chill for about 30 minutes. Meanwhile, preheat the oven to 200C/400F/Gas 6.
- 5. Bake the pies for 20 minutes until golden brown. Remove to a wire rack and serve warm.
