

Edinburgh Book Festival Trip

This year all S2 pupils were given the opportunity to visit the **Book Festival** and see an author. On one visit the pupils saw the Australian author Garth Nix. Garth's Science Fiction/Fantasy books are popular at Eastwood. He talked about the difficulties he had in becoming published. How he wrote a book (longhand first and then onto a computer); how listening to music altered his writing. He also gave some short readings and answered questions from the audience. One S2 pupil Leo Kumagai was delighted to get a book signed by Garth. In another visit two authors, Anne Cassidy and Sophie MacKenzie, talked about how they created mystery and excitement in their books. Some of the group had read books by the authors and they heard about the techniques adopted to weave a story in an hour which left the group feeling inspired. The final visit saw authors Keith Gray, Kate Harrison and Sally Nicols focus on the subject of the afterlife, a subject often taboo in society. The 3 writers talked about how they approached this topic in different ways and then illustrated it by reading short extracts from their latest works and answering questions. Organising the trips has been a massive undertaking. A big thank you must go to all the staff involved but especially Mrs McLaughlin.

Sunflower Competition

As part of their Biology course, Dr Lowe's S4 Biology class took part in a **Sunflower growing competition**.

Pupils grew the plants from seed and learned how to look after the plant at different stages in its lifecycle. In June the height of all the plants were measured to decide the
