Dear Parent

February has seen the completion of the S5/6 Prelim Exams and the focus is now very much on the drive towards the SQA Exams in May. This year the SQA Exams start particularly early and it is worth pointing out to parents and pupils alike that 54—56 pupils will have only four school days in class after the Easter holidays before the SQA exams begin - That is less than 5 full school weeks away. It is vitally important therefore that pupils use the month of March to fully prepare. To assist pupils with this preparation and to achieve their full potential in the SQA exams the school has a number of initiatives running. Firstly a full programme of after school Supported Study classes will be running through March and April, details of the schedule for these classes is available on the school website. Secondly each individual 54 and 55 pupil has been issued with target grades for the final exams. These target grades are not predicted grades but are based on prelim and NAB results, and are something that with hard work and study can be achieved. Finally Easter School will again run during the Easter holidays. In line with other East Renfrewshire schools there is a small charge levied for Easter School classes. This charge remains at the same level as last year (£4.50 per day or £2.50 for a morning or afternoon session). Easter School is free to any pupil in receipt of a free school meal. An information leaflet will be issued in mid march giving details of the Easter school programme.

Honoured Visitor

Eastwood High School was honoured to be visited by retired Chief Superintendant John Carnochan a national figure in policing and sociology. DCS Carnachan OBE and recipient of the Queen's Police medal, was invited to the school by our own campus Police Officer Alastair Lindsay to talk to S4 about his work in violence reduction. John Carnochan set up the Strathclyde Police violence reduction unit in 2004 ostensibly to reduce knife crime in the Greater Glasgow area but the initiative was so successful that it was introduced nationwide a couple of years

later. In his talk he focussed on the sociology and mental health issues contributing to violence, making good personal decisions to avoid risk, and keeping safe in the city.



Literacy Flash Mob

The Atrium was treated to a "Literacy Flash Mob" event involving both staff and pupils on the 3rd of February. The event included a short film specially made to promote the importance of literacy throughout the school. This will be added to our school website. The event attracted a large crowd and certainly achieved its aim of raising awareness of literacy skills across the curriculum and in life.

Sports News

February has been a most successful month for Eastwood High School's athletes. In the Scottish Schools

Indoor Athletics Championships Catherine Palmer S5 won a silver medal in the senior high jump with a leap of 1.65m. and Erin Wallace added the Scottish Schools indoor U16 1500m gold medal to her National U15 800m title won the previous week. Erin also won the Scottish U15 National Cross Country Championship on Saturday the 22nd of February. On the 2nd of February Ross Lipp of S2 was part of the U16 relay team that won the Scottish Indoor Championships at the Emirates Arena.





At the East Renfrewshire Cross Country Championships held on 24th February Erin Wallace won gold in the S2 girls and Jamie Sturrock won bronze in the S3 boys. In the team competitions the S2 girls won gold, S2 boys won silver, S3 girls





won bronze, 53 boys won silver and the senior boys won silver. Well done to all.

In Karate Megan McNair won the U15 girls gold medal at the Wishaw Grand Prix held on the 15th of February. Megan is a black belt and has been competing since she was 4!

In football well done to Ryan Lockie of S4 who was again selected for the Scotland U16 Squad. Well done also to the U16s football team who have won through to the semi finals of the St Mirren Cup defeating Mearns Castle HS 3-1 away in the $\frac{1}{4}$ final. Unfortunately our U14s were knocked out of their St Mirren Cup competition by Gryffe HS but did beat Mearns Castle HS 4-3 in the league during February with a late winner from Jason Stewart. The U15s completed their league campaign with a 2-0 win over Mearns Castle HS giving them a 3rd place finish.

The Eastwood teams have been selected for this year's British Schools Karting Competition. Following qualifying at Scotkart Cambuslang Mrs Ross selected Alan Regan, Iain McIntosh and Harris Ali for Eastwood A, whilst Hassan Bashir, Stuart King and Kevin King were selected for Eastwood B. Mr Wood's S2/3 basketball team managed a last gasp win over Renfrew High 26-25 to clinch a place in the Renfrewshire Cup semi final. Luke Sinclair scored the crucial points with a free throw in the final seconds. Finally in rugby the U15 rugby team drew 10-10 away to Duncanrig HS.

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
