

Congratulations to Erin Wallace (S6) who, on 21st July, won 1500m the gold medal at the Commonwealth Youth Games held in the Bahamas. It has been an excellent summer for Erin who also finished 6th in the 800m and came second in an U20 Triathlon European Cup event in Lausanne Switzerland on 19th August.

Also in Triathlon congratulations to Kate Richardson (S4) who became the Scottish Triathlon Champion (age 15/16) at the Scottish Youth Triathlon Championships held at Bellahouston on 17th June. In the same event Clare Wallace (54) came 4th.

In athletics Alyson Bell (S3) became the Scottish U15 100m champion at the Scottish National Athletics Championships held at Scotstoun this month (She's only 13!). Alyson also represented Scotland in the Celtic Games in Dublin where she came 2nd in the U16 200m. Alyson,

along with Clare Wallace (54), represented Giffnock North Athletics Club at the Gothenburg International Meet where Alyson won the U14 300m and came 2nd in the U14s 80m. Clare came 9th in the U16 2000m. The Scottish National Championships also saw Fraser Lipp (S3) win bronze in the U15 Javelin and Clark Marshall (S3) finish 4th in the U15 Pole Vault.

Congratulations to Clare Wallace who won 2 gold & 2 bronze medals at the Scottish Summer Swim Meet and on 12th August won silver in the Scottish Open Water Swimming 2000m (age 15/16). The 19th of August saw Kate Richardson (S4 - pictured above) become Scottish U16 Cycling Youth

Time Trial Champion winning by over a minute from her nearest rival at Monikie in Angus. On Saturday 1st July Max Skillen (S4), Kevin King (S5) and Craig MacFarlane (S6) represented Eastwood and Scotland at the final of the British Schools Karting Championships held at Whilton Mill near Daventry. Despite not being placed Mrs Ross' team thoroughly enjoyed the

occasion and performed admirably.

In football congratulations to Chloe Colguhoun (S2) who has been selected for the Scotland U15 Girls Squad. Also well done to Kyle Taylor (S6) who has been selected for the U18 Paisley & District squad.

Eastwood cricket star Kess Sajjad (S6) has been playing for the Scotland U17 team against Lincolnshire, Durham and Derbyshire. Unfortunately injury prevented Kess

playing for Scotland U19s in the World Cup qualifying series, however he remains the highest wicket taker in Scotland at U19 level this season.

Finally well done to Kirsty Anderson (S4) on competing for Eglinton PC at the British Pony Club Championships held at Cholmondeley Castle Cheshire on 19th & 20th August. Her team came 10th in the UK out of 300 entries.
