#### Dear Parent

During the Easter holidays Eastwood HS again hosted a well attended Easter School with classes being run in the vast majority of subject areas. We are currently running Supported Study after school and on weekends in many subject areas to supplement pupils' learning. It is vitally important that all S4, S5 and S6 pupils "PREPARE, PRACTICE and PERFORM" over the next 5 weeks. I know that I can count on parental support to ensure that everyone in S4—S6 is studying at least 4 hours per day from now until the SQA exams are over. IT IS TOUGH BUT WELL WORTH IT IN THE LONG TERM.

On another front I would like to take this opportunity to seek parental support looking ahead to next term. I'm sure that you will agree that it is important that Eastwood HS and its pupils receive their full allocation of resources. Many parents entitled to receive a free school meal for their children do not apply, OR RE-APPLY, for one each summer. Some important aspects of the school's funding is based on free meal entitlement and increasingly, with local authority cuts, the council is now charging for additional services such as Easter School - free to those registered for a free meal. The cashless catering system means that no one knows who is in receipt of a free meal. It is therefore really important that everyone entitled, applies or re-applies, for next session. Application forms with the qualification criteria are available from the school office, the East Renfrewshire Council website or Customer First. If you feel that you might be entitled to apply please do so, and help the school and your child(ren) receive their fair share of resources. Over the session it is worth around £400 per child to recipients as well as exempting them from Easter School payments etc.


In swimming Lauren Chalmers (S2) has had her best ever year culminating in great success at the Scottish National Age Group Swimming Championships held recently

at Tollcross International Pool in Glasgow. Lauren won silver in the girls age 14 category in the 1500m freestyle clocking the 6th fastest time in the UK this year. Lauren had a busy few days at the event recording the following finishes in her other races 400m individual medley - 5th, 400m freestyle - 12th, 200m butterfly - 4th, 100m butterfly - 7th, 800m freestyle - 7th, and 200m freestyle - 16th.

Finally in rugby well done to Adam Mitchell (S5) & Graham Murchie (S6) on being part of the Whitecraigs U18 team that won the West of Scotland Shield winning 29-14 against Stewartry RFC.—Adam has also been selected for the Glasgow and West U18 District Squad.



Finally it has been a busy and successful month in football. The U15 Girls team., despite being a bit under strength due to injuries, qualified for the Scottish finals of the SSFA Cashback 7s to be held at Toryglen Regional Football Centre in late May. In boys football the S1s lost 2-5 to Williamwood in the semi final of the St Mirren Cup (Max Bannerman with both goals), however they finished the season by winning the Silver League with an unbeaten league record.
