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Dear Parent

As we enter October it is vitally important that pupils in S4 and S5 begin to put in the extra revision and consolidation work to reinforce what is being learned in the class. Too often pupils are willing to drift at this time of year letting grades slip away. Just doing enough in class will not be sufficient for your child to achieve their full potential, they must be testing and pushing themselves with additional work at home. Pupils should be completing SQA past paper questions on the topics they have already covered and talking to their teachers about which bits of the course they are finding difficult. Now is the time to change things that they currently can't do into things they can do. To this end S5 have just received their targets for the year, these will also be given to parents. These targets are result of a statistical process based on S4 prelim and National 5 performance. The targets are designed to be aimed for, achieved and exceeded the target grade is the statistically "most likely" not a ceiling on ambition. In relation to S4 their targets will be issued after the prelims but as you receive this newsletter there are only 34 school days to the start of those 54 prelims. Again this year the mantra is "Higher Standards, Higher Expectations, More Opportunity- No Excuses".

Finally can I make one last plea to parents to apply for or RE-APPLY for free school meals for your children if you feel that you might be entitled. Some aspects of the school's funding is allocated based on the numbers eligible for and receiving free school meals. By applying via East Renfrewshire Council Customer First you are helping ensure that we get our fair share of resources.

The U13 boys started their season with and excellent 50-15 win against Shawlands Academy (try scorers Luke Stewart 3, Cameron Healy, Oliver McKendrick, Jack Tuck 2, Finlay Orr,

Kyle McLean and Addison Linden). The U14 boys also played Shawlands Academy in their first game of the season losing 26-34 in a tight game (try scorers Lewis Zanforlin and Calum Macbeth, Lewis also bagged 3 conversions). The U16s played two Scottish Cup ties this month defeating St Andrews Secondary 57-22 in the first round (try scorers Jack Vershueren (3), Charlie Barber (2), Mac Thompson, Liam Bothwell, Ben Wilson & Scott Fosbury). 


