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#### Dear Parent

This is a crucial time for pupils in S5/6 as we face the Prelim exams that started on 28th January. Along with Mrs McCartney I have already spoken to senior pupils at assemblies about the importance of these exams. By now everyone should be well into a home revision timetable in preparation. I would also like to remind pupils and parents of the supported study programme that is running in most subject areas and the positive impact that participation in this programme can have on results. The Prelim exam timetable and supported study timetable are both on the school website. I know that I can count on parental support to ensure that all pupils in S5/6 achieve their full potential in these exams.

In a similar way our S4 pupils are about to enter the most crucial phase of their education so far. During February and March many subjects at National 5 and National 4 will be working on the completion of value added units and projects that form a key part of courses. On one hand pupils will fail their courses if they do not complete these pieces of work to a high standard and secondly there is the potential for underachievement if pupils do not put in the required work to achieve their best. These projects and value added units should be seen as an opportunity to produce high quality work that adds value to the overall grade when combined with exam performance in May - It is effort and hard work that will make the positive difference. To this end all 54 pupils will be issued in February with targets to aim for in their National 4 and 5 courses based on their prelim performance and teachers' best judgement based on internal assessments. These targets are what the S4 pupils could achieve but they will require hard work and study; they will not be achieved for simply turning up. For 4th year the final run in to their May exams, a mere 41 school days away, starts now. S Maxwell

Starting with football this month the girls U18's football team unfortunately lost 9-4 in their last 16 Scottish Shield match away against Turnbull HS. The girls having progressed to this 4th round stage found Turnbull HS really difficult opponents. The senior boys team however have had a better month winning their 2nd round St Mirren Cup tie on penalties after a 2-2 draw. away to Barrhead HS. Scott MacLachlan scored the winning penalty however Matthew

McGoldrick's last touch of the game equaliser will live long in the memory. Finally in football it is good to see former pupil Calvin McGrory becoming a 1st team regular at Queens Park FC.

Massive well done to our S2 netball team who beat Gleniffer HS 49-18 in the 2nd round knockout stage of the Scottish Cup Gold league - Securing a bonus point in the process. The captain was Keira Ratter and Player of the Match was Beth Allan.

The Eastwood HS swim team performed with great distinction at the Scottish Schools Swimming Championships held at Tollcross Pool this month. Esther Jamieson (S3) achieved a personal best in the 100m freestyle (age 15/16) but even that wasn't enough to make the final! Lauren Chalmers (S3) swimming in the age 15/16 category came 4th in the 400m individual medley and 6th in the 200m butterfly. However congratulations to Clare Wallace (S5) who won bronze in the 200m and 400m freestyle in the 17-19 years category.

Alyson Bell (54 & aged 15) won gold at the Scottish Indoor Athletics Championships on 26th January. This was a phenomenal performance in the <u>U17</u> 200m (Her winning time was 25.17 seconds). Alyson also won silver in the 60m (losing by one hundredth of a second) in a time of 7.65 seconds. Also in athletics well done to Andrew Combe (S2) on being part of the Giffnock North AC team that took silver in the U15 Boys cross country in the Belfast XC Challenge se-

ries race. Finally former pupil Erin Wallace continues to move up the British Athletics rankings following an excellent performance for Scotland U20s in the televised Stirling International XC relays. She is now training with Laura Muir's performance squad at the Emirates in Glasgow.

The Eastwood High Karting Club had their first competition of the season at Scotkart Cambuslang in December. As ever the competition was intense with some excellent racing. In the end out of 30 competitors Bradley Scott (S6) won, with a fastest lap of 35.732 seconds, Lewis

McNaughton (53) was second (36.300 seconds) and Scott King (51) came third (36.597 seconds).

Finally well done to David Graham (S6) who came 4th in the Kendo Northern Open Team Championships held at Scotstoun Arena just before Christmas. This was an open competition for competitors from all over the UK with David competing in the Men's Open Category.

















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
