As you will appreciate the school office is a very busy place in a school of 1100 pupils therefore any assistance that parents could give in the following areas would be greatly appreciated



ing we have staged. Thank you to everyone who came along.








Sports News

As ever November has been a very busy month for Eastwood sports. Firstly at the World Junior Tae Kwon Do Championships held in Motherwell on 2nd November Ross Campbell (S5) won 3 Gold and a Bronze in various competitions and categories, whilst brother and sister Tony (S3) and Pinky (S2) Li won 2 golds and a Bronze in their age and categories.



It has been a mixed month for the Eastwood High's football teams however there have been some notable achievements for individual players. Niamh Gorman (S5) won the Glasgow City U17 "Most Improved Player" award at the end of their season. Niamh, along with Maja Paszenda (S5) was part of the Glasgow City U17 league and cup winning double team. Well done to Greig Allen (53) who continues to represent Heart of Midlothian at U15 (as captain), U16 and even U18 level - remarkable as he is still 14! On the pitch our U14s won their first game of the season 3-0 against Barrhead HS in the league (an Oliver McKendrick hat-trick) and our senior girls performed well in the 2nd round of the East Kenfrewshire league defeating Williamwood HS before losing out narrowly 1-3 against St Ninians HS. Both our S1 boys and senior boys were knocked out of their Scottish Cups against Boclair Ac. And St Lukes HS respectively. Well done to the boys Junior Basketball team who defeated St Ninians HS 44-30, Stewarton Academy 52-20 and Gryffe HS 48-28 to progress to the next round of the Scottish Cup - qualifying as run-

ners-up to Park Mains HS in the group stage.
In rugby all of the Eastwood teams have been in action this month. On 6th November Eastwood hosted 3 teams from Oban HS. The games were tight (well two of them were!) the S1s losing 38–42, the S2s 14-60 and the U16s 17-27 in the pool stage of the Scottish

Quaich. On 13th November Shawlands Academy were the visitors to Whitecraigs. The S1 girls lost their fixture by 2 tries but played some good rugby. The S2 girls however scored a terrific win in an exciting end to end game whilst the S1 boys lost out narrowly 34-40 again in an exciting match. In addition to this the S1 boys, S2 boys and U16 boys all won their fixtures against St Andrews HS at Whitecraigs on 21st November. It was an important win for the U16s 41-25 as that game was in the pool stages of the Scottish Quaich.
