Curricular Matters

51/52 Rotations

Lessons from Auschwitz project

Three of our senior pupils were selected to represent Scotland on the Lessons from Auschwitz project—Hannah Campbell-Finnie (55), Jessica Anderson (56) and Jodi Keys (55).



The pupils have completed virtual tours of the concentration camp and listened to the accounts of Holocaust survivors. They have also been working hard, giving up numerous lunchtimes to complete their online training modules and courses. They are currently completing their final steps to become qualified Holocaust Ambassadors, when they will run small workshops with pupils within the faculty to share their experiences.



News from the Library

Scotland is the first country in the world to have lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex (LGBTI) inclusive education embedded in the curriculum.

The library was fortunate to be the first to deliver to all S3 students a lesson to raise awareness, empathy and inclusion regarding the LGBTI community. Fiction gives us empathy: it puts us inside the minds of other people, gives us the gift of 'seeing the world

I read to the classes two favourite passages from Black Flamingo by Dean Atta and All Boys Aren't Blue by George M. Johnson. We then talked as a class about actions to make our school more inclusive and safe for everyone regardless of



their sexual orientation or gender identity.


Eastwood High Staff-Pupil Christmas Cup
