


THE PURPOSE OF TONIGHT

Biology National 4 and 5



Biology, the study of living things, plays a crucial role in our everyday existence and is an increasingly important subject in the modern world. Biology affects everyone and aims to find solutions to many of the world's problems. Advances in technologies have made this varied subject more exciting and relevant than ever.

Skills that the pupils will gain:

- an understanding of how of Biology affects everyday life.
- scientific and analytical thinking skills related to Biology.
- an understanding of biology's role in scientific issues and relevant applications of biology, including the impact these could make on society and the environment
- skills for learning, life and work, including those of literacy and numeracy.
- Using technology, equipment and materials, safely, in practical scientific activities

Experiences that the pupils will encounter:

In the first unit, **Cell Biology**, pupils will develop scientific skills and learn about DNA, genes and chromosomes, how cells can be used to treat human illness and the use of micro-organisms to produce food and fuel. At National 5 pupils will also study the processes of Cell Culture and Genetic Engineering.

In the second unit Multi-cellular Organisms, pupils will learn about growing plants, and

Eastwood High School S2 into S3 Curricular Choices is taking place during this new term. All courses available to Eastwood High pupils are detailed in the S2 into S3 Option Choice booklet now available on the school website. Or click on link below:

Please take some time over the coming weeks to read the information available and consider all options before making an informed choice. Please encourage your child to give careful consideration to their choices as, given the current uncertain circumstances, changes to original choices at a later date may be limited.

Curricular choices take the form of a column structure at this stage – the available columns are found on the final page of the booklet linked above. Please note the following important points regarding your child's options:

- Pupils must select one choice only from each column
- A choice must be selected from every column
- Levels (i.e. National 3/4/5) will not be finalised until the end of the BGE (around March 2024 in most cases, sometimes later)
- Your son/daughter's S2 report, available on Parent Portal, should offer advice from current teachers about subject progress. S2 Pupils will have discussed the options process during PSE and weekly assemblies.
- Pastoral Care staff will meet S2 pupils from Wednesday 1st February to finalise and agree options. The option choice form should be completed prior to this.
- While we will do our best to accommodate all options, choices are provisional on staffing and timetable
 constraints. Any required amendments will be discussed directly with those affected once the timetable is
 available (around April/May 2023).

What is the SCQF?

Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework

- It's Scotland's lifelong learning framework designed to help people of all ages and circumstances to access appropriate education and training over their lifetime.
- It helps pupils visualise and plan their learning journey.
- It helps people understand qualifications and how they relate/compare to one another.
- It recognises people's learning and gives them credit for what they've achieved. 1 credit point = notional 10 hours learning

THE SCOTTISH CREDIT AND QUALIFICATIONS FRAMEWORK




