

WHAT IS SCQF?

SCQF stands for Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework.

The SCQF is a way of comparing Scottish qualifications to other qualification frameworks. It does this by giving each qualification a level and a number of credit points.

The level of a qualification shows how difficult the learning is.

The credit points show how much learning is involved in achieving that qualification.

It covers achievements from school, college, university, and many work-based qualifications



THE FRAMEWORK ALLOWS PARENTS TO COMPARE QUALIFICATIONS THAT THEY MAY HAVE SAT AT SCHOOL, TO THE CURRENT QUALIFICATIONS.

What are SCQF Credit Points?

•Credit points are a way of showing how much time it takes, on average, to complete a qualification or learning programme. Along with the Level Descriptors, they allow learners, learning providers and employers to compare different qualifications at the same or even different levels.



HOW DO POINTS WORK IN THE SCQF?

In common with other credit systems, the SCQF works on the basis that one credit point represents the amount of learning achieved through a notional 10 hours of learning time.

This includes everything a learner has to do to achieve the outcomes in a qualification including the assessment procedures.

National 5's, Highers and Advanced Highers are all worth **24 SCQF Points**.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN UCAS AND SCQF POINTS?

UCAS is the organisation that processes applications for higher education courses, and tariff points relate to the grade at which a qualification has been achieved.

SCQF credit points are a measure of how much learning needs to be done to achieve a particular qualification, no matter the final grade.

HOW DOES THE SCQF SUPPORT **ALTERNATIVE PATHWAYS?**

Although the most common qualifications to study at school are National 5's, Highers and Advanced Highers, there are other qualifications available such as National Progression Awards.

The SCQF can:

- help plan your learning pathways and make the right choices
 help employers understand your qualifications
- help universities or colleges identify the level you have studied at in a particular subject, and make it easier to transfer credits between different learning programmes
- increase your confidence by showing you the level of learning you have achieved
- recognise other areas of formal and informal learning or skills that may help you to develop and achieve your goals.
