Good News Story -

After a long 4-year immigration process with the Bureau, one of our client's has successfully obtained British Citizenship.

The client was first supported at the Bureau in 2019 to apply for pre-settled status and again in 2021 for settled status.

The client returned to the Bureau for assistance, in applying to Naturalise as a British National in December 2021 and was successfully granted Citizenship in January 2023.

We are thrilled by this outcome for both our client and our adviser Cara, who has assisted this client since 2019.
