

A talk about Malawi

Mrs Stead and three S6 pupils from St Luke's who attended Malawi in October joined PI and RRS committee to talk about their visit to Malawi and show a video from their trip. They spoke to the group about their trip and showed a video of the school they worked in and painted and the houses and the village that the children lived in. The houses were made of mud and had straw for a roof and a cloth for a door. There were no tables or chairs in the classroom.

They told us that there were goats everywhere and that the children had very few things to play with. Mrs Stead and the boys took a parachute and bubbles with them and the children loved playing with them and had so much fun. The boys had a fabulous trip and were very sad to leave. The boys told us that



the children were desperate for shoes as the ground was always very hot. The thirty S6 pupils that were there all left a pair of shoes for the children. They were extremely sad to leave and would love to return. The RRS committee asked them lots of questions and learned so much from them.
