
We enjoyed a visit from Hopscotch Theatre company as they performed "Jack and the Beanstalk." Most children loved it but it was a little bit scary!

🛢 Have a go at writing in a variety of ways: with mud, shaving foam, on a steamy window or if we are lucky, in the snow!


Health&Wellbeing
