How you can help?

- Encourage your children to reduce, reuse, and recycle to minimize waste. Remember your reusable bags when you go to the supermarket
- Buy Fairtrade products when you can to help support farmers.
- Buy locally sourced produce to minimise your carbon footprint and increase sustainability
- Be energy efficient! Turn off lights when not in use. Turn off taps to save water. Collect rain water to use for watering plants etc.
- Small individual steps can make a huge difference globally.
