



### Twitter Group 2016/17

In order to ensure our pupils are at the heart of Tweeting and communicating with our parents and community, we have set up a Giffnock Primary Twitter Group. This group, consist of 10 Primary 6 pupils who will work in pairs each day of the week to fulfill their role as a 'Twitter Journalist'. They will drop in on a designated class, take pictures of the learning experiences and work together to create a Tweet about the learning activity.

#### How will this work?

At the start of each week, staff will note when they their pupils are taking part in an interesting and novel learning experiences. Mr. Mayer will then instruct the Twitter Journalists on that day to visit the classroom at a designated time to report on the learning and capture a Tweet. The Journalists will then return to Mr. Mayer with the story and the pictures and he will then Tweet the story at lunchtime or at the end of the school day.
