School Improvement Planning and Priorities for Session 2018-19


Giffnock Primary's Head Teacher Rob Lawson gave a brief overview of the current school improvement planning at our Parent Council AGM on Thursday October 4th. This planning highlights key focuses for the school this year, set within the context of East Renfrewshire's local authority planning and indeed national priorities. Following our strong inspection findings from Education Scotland, along with our own self-evaluation processes, key targets will include further development of how our children articulate their own learning journeys and developing the most effective methods through which we challenge all of our children.

During last school session, the Parent Council and the school's Senior Leadership Team worked closely together to build and strengthen how parents/ carers engage with the school and our children's learning. More of our parents are leading learning around the school, from our Parent 'Cookalongs' and upcoming sessions with a range of our classes, to recent support during Maths Week. We have also continued to enhance the opportunities for our families to gain further understanding of learning processes, for example through our new workshops aimed at a range of additional support needs. Our Parental Engagement Calendar on the school website provides a detailed overview. This will continue to be of utmost importance this session. Parent Councils across the authority meet regularly with the ERC Education Department, and other schools in the Woodfarm Cluster, and we will continue to take part in consultations on a range of issues.



Fundraising Sub-Committee

During each school year we organise and run quite a few events for the enjoyment of the pupils and their families. These are the Spring Fling Disco (March), Halloween Disco (October), Movie Night (March & October), Ceilidh (January), Pupils' Sponsored Event (May) and our Christmas Fayre (December).



Last year these events raised a staggering £5,583! Many of our parents/carers enjoy helping out at these fun event and to them we say a huge thank you. Going forward though, we are looking to recruit volunteers to help organise an event each with the support of the Fundraising Committee and our volunteers bank. Equalities News

At this month's Parent Equalities Forum, East Renfrewshire Council representatives shared a new initiative called Diversity Champions. This is a proposed new role where parent/carer volunteers with an interest in this area would represent their school or cluster. The focus for the role would initially be to provide more support to the school in helping to raise awareness of Equality issues and promote further communication with the wider parent forum. More news on this will follow once the specification for the role has been shared and discussed.

Follow up information on 'The Cost of the School Day' has also become available. The focus of this campaign is to ensure that we are as equitable as possible in ensuring that the life of

Refurbishment of school toilets has also taken the news recently particularly regarding the area surrounding Gender Neutral Toilets and their installation. This is an authority wide programme which means all new builds will have these facilities and also all refurbishments. Free sanitary products are going to become more widely available in all schools in an attempt to address "Period Poverty". Further information on how this will be installed will be shared as this becomes available.

Fundraising

Hey Big Spender!!! How has the money raised been spent?


As well as the management team being able to request funds at any time, we ask staff, pupil council and any other group associated with the school to request funds during the year. We hope that by involving more people in how the money is spent, the better it will be used and the more pupils that will benefit from it.

Contributions this year include £2740 on Christmas parties, presents from Santa, end of year activities e.g. leavers lunch for P7, ties for P1 and P7 and homework bags for P1. £600 was spent on a Literacy workshop, £450 of after school activities which include multi sports, Bollywood, cricket and girls football. £1,015 was also spent on the Hopscotch Theatre and £1,200 on tunnel repairs in the playground.


A full copy of the accounts will be available at the AGM, or on request from the Parent Council.
