If you don't want to print you can have a look at some ideas below to see what to look out for:

At the moment there are LOTS of dandelions and some have got their big floaty seed heads on already. Try counting how many blows you need to get all the seeds off!



If you are in Eastwood Park you might smell garlic... There is lots of wild garlic growing here and you can eat the leaves in a salad!



Finally there are bluebells appearing everywhere at the moment. See if you can spot some out on your walk. There are lots in Eastwood Park 😊 Follow the link to join the Bluebell Watch.
