



Summary of Remote Learning Nursery Class survey May 2020

Dear Parent/ Carer

During this challenging period, we want to continue to support our children's learning in the best ways possible. We also want to help all of our families in any ways that we can, and we understand that the way we deliver Remote Learning activities will impact greatly on everyone. We would also like to again thank you for your ongoing support at home, as we understand how challenging it is to balance all that is being required of family life at this time.

Twenty-three families completed the survey, over a third of our nursery families. As you can imagine, not all viewpoints were similar and, in fact, some of you gave opposite perspectives. Below we have therefore tried to extract key findings and messages to share here:

Clear and easy to follow guidance:

On the whole, feedback felt that guidance was clear and easy to follow. We will continue to focus upon this vital aspect, with two key places for all of our families to follow:

Timings for when learning activities are posted:

Whilst the majority are happy with when activities are shared, a few families expressed a desire for activities to be shared up to a week in advance. In order to be responsive to our children's activities and interests shared, along with external factors like the weather for activities, we will at this time continue to make sure that the activities are posted by the start of school day. At times and where possible, activities may be available the evening before.

Balancing the amount of learning activities provided:

Overall, families felt that there was an appropriate balance from their perspective. Therefore, a new central theme/ activity will continue to be provided each day, with additional 'strands' and 'options' which we hope some will enjoy doing in a more extended way, depending on family circumstances.
