If you are collecting things why not try to sort and group them in different ways. I found 3 "helicopters" from a sycamore tree and put them in order from **biggest** to **smallest**



I put my **biggest** and **smallest** horse chestnut leaves side by side.



I found **curvy** leaves, leaves with **pointy** edges and **spiky** fir cones!
