- Risk assessments and processes with ERC
- Classroom and school day adaptations: Hand hygiene; 2m distancing to adults; controlling of shared resources; extended start and end of day; double break-times; extended lunch sittings; classes eat lunch at same tables; zoned playground areas; adults wearing masks in communal areas; no indoor PE; no singing; BUT – a great deal of 'normal' learning and a strong 'flow' to school life
- Adults on the school premises; Academy Road





- Great start to our session given circumstances
- Wonderful children who adapt!
- Attendance actually similar to 'normal' (so far, one class self-isolated for one school week, plus a small number of individual children)
- SIP and focus upon a 'narrow' curriculum nationally and in ERC: Health & Wellbeing; Literacy; Numeracy





- Mealth & Wellbeing: Emotion Works; emotional check-ins; Growth Mindset; Resilience; additional time to create the foundations for learning
- Additional staff members and core focuses for their and other colleagues remits
- Implications for learning: more time spent in these core areas
- Skills for Learning, Life and Work; Problem Solving; Collaborative Learning; Higher-order questioning in the classroom – all still key focuses and of great significance





- Continued narrow curriculum to support our children's core learning (prepare for 'interrupted' learning throughout this session)
- ORemote Learning guidance and systems in place: Google Classrooms; home learning packs collated; Home Learning pages; guidelines for use of video/ audio; Google Meet 'live' assessments and health & wellbeing check-ins; clarity of weekly focuses for families; agreed focus upon 'extended examples' for independent consolidation where appropriate; allocation of laptops/ Chromebooks based upon equity





- Pupil Leadership: House Captains/ House System and Pupil Groups will be elected and run during November 2020, with adaptations to processes being made
- P7 transition timetable in place with Woodfarm HS; continue to do all that we can in the best ways that we can, e.g. High School Visits and P7 Christmas lunch
- Events: again as best we can, e.g. virtual assemblies;
 Nativities; Lockerbie; School Show... all TBC
- Additional parental communication ongoing: letters/ emails; newsletters; twitter feeds; website
