Making Playdough Monsters





Things your child will need to make playdough

- Flour, cup to measure
- Water
- Powder paint or food colouring, (tablespoon for paint or teaspoon for food colour)
- Wooden spoon
- Bowl

How to make Playdough

- Ask your child to measure 2 cups of flour into the bowl and then measure 1 cup of water (do not add the water yet)
- Add a tablespoon of powder paint to the flour or if using food colouring add a few drops to the cup of water
- Add the cup of water to the bowl
- Mix the ingredients together with a wooden spoon into a bowl
- After this you need to use your hands and knead the dough like you would to make bread
- Add a sprinkling of flour to the table and you can keep adding a little more as required to stop the playdough from going sticky

To promote choice and introduce working with different textures you can add items such as

- Bottle caps
- Pom poms
- Pasta
- Straws
- Bubble wrap

Your child could use the dough to make playdough monsters. They can add faces, promoting learning about different emotions. They could use:

- Googly eyes
- Buttons
- Pipe cleaners

- Your child can make more than one batch of playdough and make them different colours with each colour representing a different emotion. They could use the colours in the book for example, yellow means happy.
- Discuss emotions with your child and ask them questions like 'Can you make a happy monster?' etc. This can be shown through colours or facial expressions on the monster's face, using other materials
- What's your monsters name?
- If you are using different materials such as a pasta nose. "What does the pasta feel like?" Introduce vocabulary for textures such as smooth or rough.
- You can also make one with one eye and give your child three eyes for their monster. Ask them 'Does your monster have more eyes than mine or less?' Promotes counting.
- "What materials are you going to pick?" Promotes choice

What are the children learning?

All these conversations and questions promote your child's language, understanding of emotions, their senses, fine motor skills, choice and imagination.
