## Care Inspectorate Report

Since our last newsletter Hazeldene Family Centre was inspected by the Care Inspectorate through an unannounced inspection of our service. We were delighted to receive the following evaluations of these Quality Indicators:

We are delighted to share some of the wonderful feedback from our recent inspection. The inspectors recognised many strengths across our Family Centre:

#### · A strong, motivated team

Inspectors praised the leadership and the whole staff team for working together with energy and commitment. This teamwork has helped us keep improving our play and learning experiences for all children.

#### Warm, caring relationships

Our staff were recognised for being nurturing, kind and highly responsive to children's individual needs. Inspectors noted that children are genuinely known, valued and cared for every day.

#### • A positive team culture

Inspectors highlighted how respectful and supportive our staff are with each other, with families, and with the children. This positive ethos helps create a welcoming and calm environment for everyone.

#### • Happy, confident children

One of the things we are most proud of is that inspectors saw how happy and settled our children are. They described children as confident, having fun, and enjoying warm and nurturing care from staff who understand them well.

#### • Strong relationships with families

The inspection team recognised the strong connections we build with our families. Our staff's enthusiasm and genuine care were identified as key strengths of the centre.

#### · Child-led learning

Inspectors also praised our planning approaches, noting that learning is shaped by children's interests. Staff gather children's ideas through daily conversations, observations and reflective discussions, making sure their voices guide our play and learning.



If we ever need to close or make changes to opening arrangements due to snow, ice, or severe weather, we will inform families via GroupCall, which sends messages directly to your inbox. Please continue to let us know if your contact details change so we can update them immediately.

For closures lasting longer than a single session, we will also post updates on the Hazeldene Family Centre website, ensuring you have another reliable place to check for information.

## A Gentle Reminder About Attendance Patterns and Session Times

As we continue to work in partnership with families, we would like to offer a polite reminder about the different attendance patterns available at Hazeldene and the importance of following your child's agreed session times.

To ensure that our staffing levels always meet the required adult-to-child ratios, it is essential that children arrive and are collected within their allocated times. When children are dropped off early or collected late, it can affect these ratios and the safe, smooth running of the playroom.

For clarity, the attendance patterns currently offered are:

- 5 mornings (48 weeks): 8.00am 12.45pm
- 5 afternoons (48 weeks): 1.00pm 5.45pm
- 2.5 days (48 weeks): For example, 2 full days 8.00am 5.30pm and 1 half day 8.00am 12.45pm/ 1.00pm 5:45pm
- 5 days (38 weeks): 9.00am 3.00pm

We kindly ask all families to ensure they adhere to their child's agreed attendance pattern. This helps us maintain high-quality care, keep all children safe, and support the routines that make the day run smoothly for everyone.

If you are unsure of your child's pattern or feel your circumstances have changed, please speak to us—we're always happy to help.

# Keeping Everyone Healthy The Importance of Handwashing

As we move through the winter months, we naturally see a rise in seasonal bugs, colds, and flu. It's very common for young children to build their immune systems while attending nursery, and a certain amount of illness is expected at this age. However, we also have an important role to play in reducing the spread of infection and keeping everyone in our community as healthy as possible.

To support this, the Family Centre places a strong emphasis on regular, effective handwashing, and during the winter season we 'ramp up' these routines even further. Handwashing is one of the simplest and most effective ways to prevent germs from spreading, and it helps protect not only the children, but also families and staff.

Our handwashing routines include:

- · Washing hands as soon as children arrive in the morning
- Before and after snack and lunch
- After using the toilet
- After outdoor play
- After coughing, sneezing, or wiping noses

These routines are well embedded, and the children are becoming increasingly independent and confident in managing them. We continue to support them with gentle reminders and lots of encouragement.

We ask for your help at home too. Encouraging good handwashing before nursery, after school runs, and during family routines helps reinforce the message and strengthens the protective measures we have in place.

Thank you for your continued support in helping us keep Hazeldene a safe, healthy place for everyone. A little extra care goes a long way—especially during the winter months.

## Primary One Registration

At the start of December you can apply for a P1 school catchment place for your child if you currently live within East Renfrewshire Council or will be living within the authority by the start of the new session in August 2026. #### **Deferring Entry**

If a child is **not** yet 5 years old (DOB from 01.08.2021 to 28.02.22) on 1 August in the year which they are supposed to commence their primary education, parents/carers have a right to defer their child's entry to primary 1 until the following academic year. In such cases, children will be entitled to an additional year of funded early learning and childcare.

Parents of children who reach the age of five before 1 August have no automatic right to defer their child's entry to school. It's expected that all children aged 5 before 1 August would start Primary 1 in that year. Where a child has turned 5 prior to 1 August and the parent wishes to defer entry to primary school, an exceptional application should be made. All exceptional applications are considered by a panel to decide if a further year of a nursery funding is appropriate.

In either case you <u>must</u> still complete a Primary 1 catchment application where you can note your intention to defer/apply to defer.




## ELC Registration for 2026/27

At the start of December you can apply for a nursery place for session 2026/27.

You **must** apply using the address that you currently live at. If you're due to move house in the foreseeable future you must supply evidence of this and your placement may be allocated on a provisional basis. You may need to supply further evidence before your child begins their placement.

The deadline for submitting an online ELC application for session 2026-27 closes on **31 January 2025**. If you apply for a place **prior** to the January deadline, allocation emails will be issued towards the end of April. If you do not receive an email, please remember to check your junk mail before contacting East Renfrewshire Early Learning and Childcare.

**If you currently attend Hazeldene Family Centre and intend to stay with us** for your child's preschool year and you are happy with your attendance pattern then **you do not** need to submit an application. However, should you wish to try and change your child's attendance pattern for session 2026/27 (*e.g. move from AM Only to Core 9-3*) then you **should** submit an application by the January deadline. If successful, the new attendance pattern would commence in August 2026 of the child's pre-school year.









## Toy Fund

You may have noticed that Linda has been emailing information to you regarding setting up ParentPay for Toy Fund donations. This is because we do not accept cash donations for security reasons. A reminder that Toy Fund donations are **completely voluntary** and all funds raised go towards experiences for **all** the children.

The Toy Fund Committee met recently to discuss recent spending and ideas moving forwards. Should any parent wish to be involved in the Toy Fund Committee you are more than welcome to attend our next meeting - currently scheduled for **9:00am on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2026.**
