Job Description

Pupil Groups at Kirkhill Primary School play an important leadership role within our school.

We also provide peer mediation for all playgrounds in the school and are able to resolve minor conflicts and ensure that all children are 'included' and 'nurtured'. We have been trained by our Active School Coordinator to ensure that we are well equipped with activity ideas and have the ability to teach younger children how to cooperate and work well with each other. We ensure that we create a 'respectful' ethos across the school and by encouraging everyone to be 'responsible' and caring towards each other. We are confident, we work in a team and we act as role models for all the pupils in Kirkhill Primary School.
