- 2. Entries may come from individuals or groups, using the appropriate application forms (found within this document and online), and must be submitted by the school/college the entrant(s) attends.
- 3. All entries submitted should be original and can include school/college curriculum work.
- 4. Please submit entries by either 1) email to <u>competition@theredcardscotland.org</u> or 2) via WeTransfer. Entries must be accompanied with supporting application forms. Please see below for guidelines:

Art: Images exhibiting your artwork emailed to <u>competition@theredcardscotland.org</u> or via WeTransfer. Please keep physical artwork in case it is announced as a finalist for the Awards Ceremony.

Creative writing/short story: Emailed to <u>competition@theredcardscotland.org</u> No more than 900 words. Please include title. Where other language is used, an English translation should also be submitted if possible.

Poetry: Emailed to <u>competition@theredcardscotland.org</u>. No more than 60 lines. Where other language is used, an English translation should also be submitted if possible.

Film/Multimedia: Emailed to <u>competition@theredcardscotland.org</u> or via WeTransfer. No more than 7 minutes running time.

Music: Emailed to <u>competition@theredcardscotland.org</u> or via WeTransfer. No more than 4 minutes. Compositions must be original and not infringe copyright of existing published materials. Radio 'jingles' should be one minute maximum.

Dance/Drama: Videos sent via WeTransfer to <u>competition@theredcardscotland.org</u>. Drama scripts should be a maximum five minutes in length. A recording of the production to accompany the script would be welcome.

Research Project: Emailed to <u>competition@theredcardscotland.org</u> or via WeTransfer. 600 words maximum including attachments. This can be presented in any medium.

- 5. Judging will take place during May 2021. Finalists will be notified at the end of May with the overall category winner being announced at the awards ceremony, planned for Hampden Park, Glasgow later in the term. The judging panel will include subject experts appointed by Show Racism the Red Card.
- 6. All works submitted will be retained by Show Racism the Red Card. We reserve the right to reproduce all works in printed and digital media for promotional and educational purposes.
