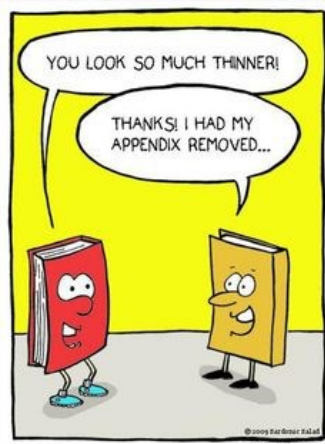

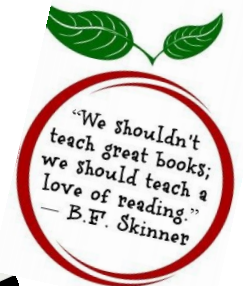

Bonus Level—beat the BOS32

Tweety Pie: create a tweet length blurb off your book.

Remember: a tweet only uses 140 characters—that includes spaces—your editing skills

will have to be good.

Top Tip: use the real blurb and pick out the most evocative words



Level One—personalized DM item

Map: Create a map of the locations your main characters have visited.

REMEMBER: keep it simple to about 5/6 locations

TOP TIP: you can do it in the style of a pirate map with an X marking the spot.

Level Five— gain EPIC status

LOL: Create a TXT conversation between the two main characters regarding a turning point in your book.

REMEMBER: use abbreviations as you would in your own phone— and keep it nice!

TOP TIP: imagine you are the main character—how would they speak? Use a section from the book and simply convert it.

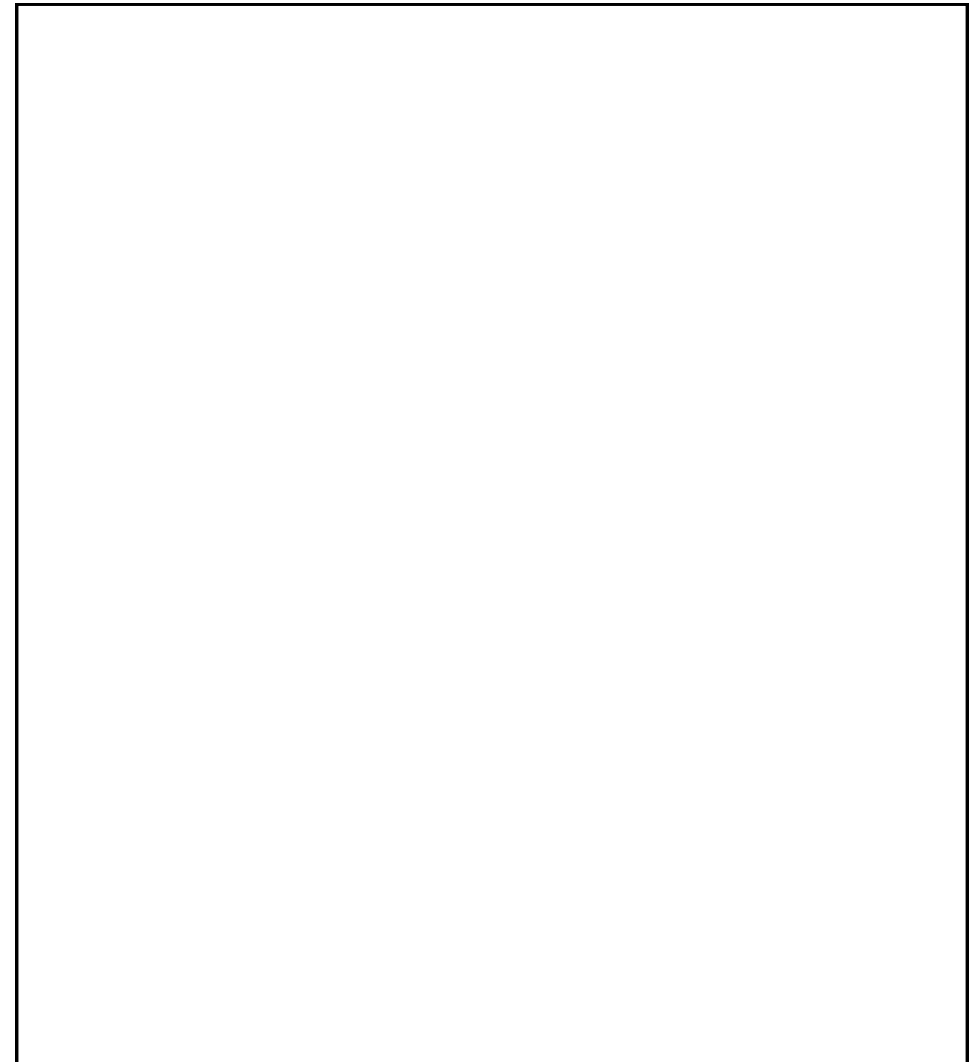


Level Two—become guild leader

The author of your book is coming to give a talk at your local library. The council have asked you to create a poster to publicise the event. Why should people come along?

REMEMBER: include the name of the library and the date and time of the event.

TOP TIP: Look at some posters in the library for inspiration and some ideas about lay-out. Log on and find out about the author on their web site (if they have one).



Level Three—through the portal

Make a list of all the important words in your book and create your own **word cloud**. This

works best if you note them down as you go along.

REMEMBER: the more words the fuffier the cloud.

Top Tip : use an online source such as wordle and then print it out—more options and looks

better.

Level Four—claim shield of invincibility

Your main character has hired you to **organise their birthday party**. You have to pick a location, the food, the music, a guest list and make up an invitation.

REMEMBER: use your character's likes and dislikes as your inspiration.

TOP TIP: You have an unlimited budget... go wild! You may need more paper for this—

just ask!
