




Improving Our School Uniform Why does it Matter?

Improving Our School Uniform What are the current problems?



- Lack of uniformity in wearing Blazers
- Skirts too short and tight
- Leggings
- Trousers worn too low
- Jeans
- Belts
- Shirts untucked and unbuttoned
- Multi-Coloured Underwear
- Ties too loose and too low
- Hoodies / Jumpers
- Trainers
- Elaborate jewellery





Improving Our School Uniform What are the current problems?

In part these problems have been contributed to by...

 a lack of specific advice from the school about items of uniform

allied to..

a lack of consistency in enforcing uniform standards in school

With the support of pupils and parents we now intend to address these issues





Improving Our School Uniform The Consultation Process




ERC Standard Circular 6: Dressing for Excellence published in August 2011

'...schools should consult widely on their proposed uniform policy and changes to an established policy...'



•Surveyed over 1000 Parents / Pupils / Staff







A clear mandate exists for the improvement of our school uniform



Improving Our School Uniform Blazers



79% of Parents say that:

'In our policy on school uniform a blazer should be compulsory for all pupils'

A black blazer (woollen or polyester) will be compulsory for all pupils at Mearns Castle from August 2012.

Blazers should be worn to and from school. Blazers must also be worn in school at all times but can be removed during lessons.

During inclement weather, pupils should wear a black outdoor jacket over their blazer. Outdoor jackets should then be removed in school and stored in lockers.







Improving Our School Uniform Other Items of Uniform

88% of Parents say that:

'Our policy on school uniform should feature specific, approved items of school uniform eg. Skirts, jumpers etc'


Pupil Focus groups consistently told us to tell pupils more precisely exactly what they should wear and that they would wear it – as long as everyone is made to wear it!



Improving Our School Uniform Skirts



 2 black skirt styles will be compulsory – box pleat and straight



- Skirts should be worn no higher than 2" above the knee with plain black tights or knee high black socks
- Tight fitting, short, 'body-con' type skirts are not acceptable school uniform



Improving Our School Uniform Trousers



- Girls can wear appropriate black formal bootcut trousers
- Boys must wear formal black school trousers up to the waist with a black belt and plain buckle if required
- The following items of clothing are not acceptable school uniform:

Pin-striped trousers
Black Denims
Jeans-style trousers
Leggings
Shorts
Footless tights





Improving Our School Uniform Shirts/Ties/Jumpers



- A formal white school shirt must be worn tucked in
- Ties must be worn up to the neck, properly tied, with the MCHS badge showing
- A plain black V-neck jumper or cardigan where the tie is clearly visible can be worn
- The following items of clothing are not acceptable school uniform:

Hooded tops
Vest tops
Tops with logos
Tracksuit tops



Improving Our School Uniform Footwear



- Formal black school shoes with a black sole and black laces if appropriate must be worn
- The following items of footwear are not acceptable school uniform:

any training shoes or plimsoles including all black items any footwear that has a sole that is not black any footwear featuring logos



Improving Our School Uniform Retailers

- Acceptable to purchase the correct items of uniform from any supplier
- We will offer to support parents' who are having difficulty providing items of school uniform



Improving Our School Uniform Enforcement

93% of Parents say that:

'I am happy to support a firmer stance on school uniform standards'

Pupil Focus groups consistently told us to tell pupils more precisely exactly what they should wear and that they would wear it – as long as everyone is made to wear it!

We are confident that given the response to our consultation and through working in partnership with our pupils and parents we will get high levels of willingness and co-operation in improving the standard of our school uniform





Improving Our School Uniform Enforcement

'...Under no circumstances should young people be denied access to education or full curriculum or assessment opportunities because they do not comply with the school's dress code...'

ERC Standard Circular 6: Dressing for Excellence

- Monitoring checks before school and Period 1
- Uniform store including recycled blazers
- Parents to be sent a text
- UPBEAT Demerits → Off colour → losing privileges eg.
 Christmas Dances, Charities Week, School Trips
