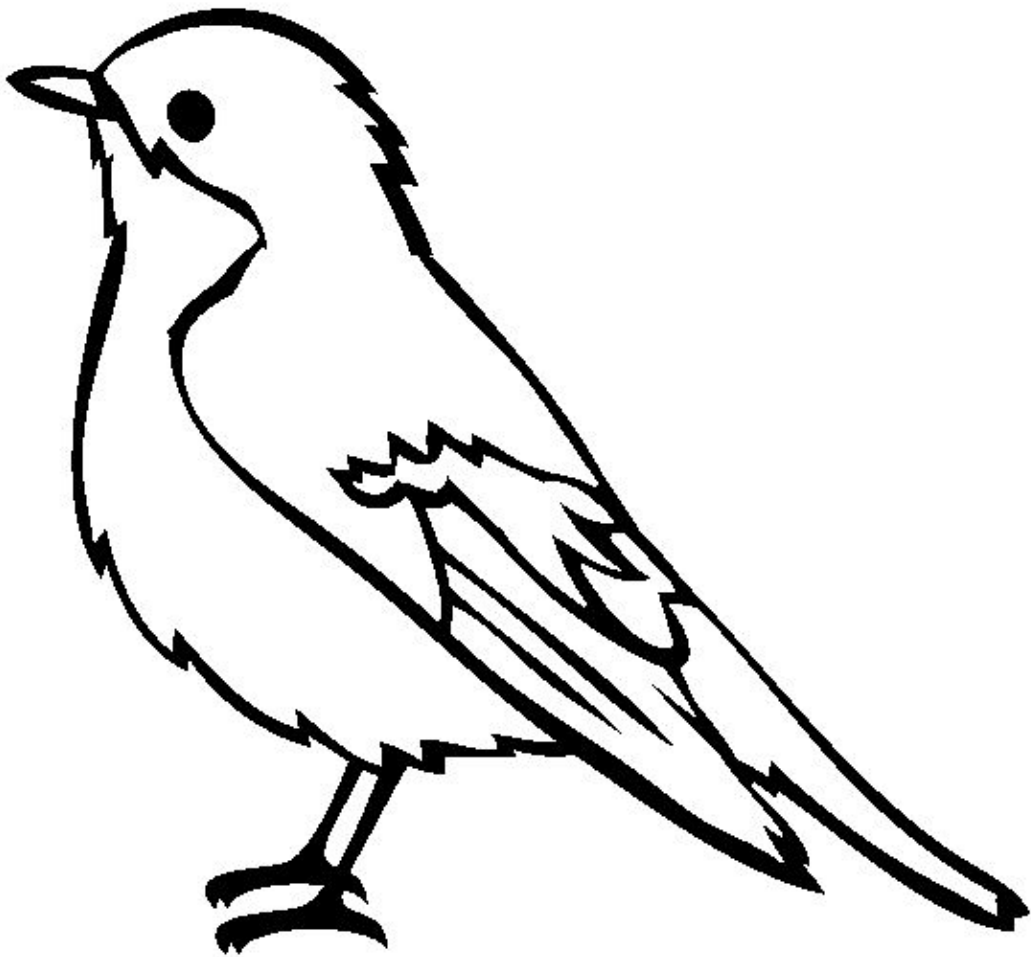


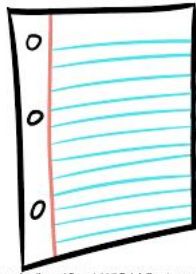

Bird cake

You will need

1 Cut your paper to size, then cover your tubes with glue and wrap the paper around them.

2 Using a pen or hole punch, insert a hole at the side of each tube, about a third of the way down.

3 Glue the two tubes together so that the holes are facing the outside.

4 Insert string into one of the holes from the outside of the tube. Bring it through the tube end and tie a chunky knot. Gently pull the string back from the outside. Repeat on the other side.

5 Place a rubber band around the tubes to help the glue set. Leave to dry over night.

6 Remove the elastic band and then decorate them with pens!

7 Go wildlife detecting!

The knot will stop the string coming back through the hole.

- Raisins
- Bird seed
- Grated cheese
- Lard or suet

1. Aiming for equal amounts of each ingredient, place all into a bowl and mix well together.

There is no need to melt lard as it will soften at room temperature and mix with the other ingredients.

2. Taking your yoghurt pots, make a small hole in the base of each one.
3. Take around 1 metre of string, make a knot at one end and thread the string through the hole in the pot so the knot is inside.
4. Spoon your mixture into each pot, pressing it down evenly until all mixture is used up. Place into the fridge to set.
5. Once mixture is set ease the yoghurt pots off the cake.
6. Hang outside for birds to enjoy.

Cheerio Bird Feeder

You will need:

- Cheerio cereal
- String
- Dolly clothes peg



1. Attach string to the dolly peg at the bottom leaving a long length of string.

2. Thread cheerio cereal onto string until full. Tie small knot at the top leaving a small length to hang up.
3. Hang feeder outside in your garden. The above can also be made using string or pipe cleaners which are then tidied together and hung up on a tree.
