Parental views were collected at the February Parents Evening. A total of **207** parents responded to the survey giving their views on five questions.

There was also an opportunity for parents to write extended answers to the question; Are there are areas of focus that you believe the school should include in the School Improvement Plan for 2017/18?

Of the 25 comments left by parents; 8 were overwhelmingly positive, 7 questioned certain practices and 10 had suggestions for areas the school could develop in 2017/18.

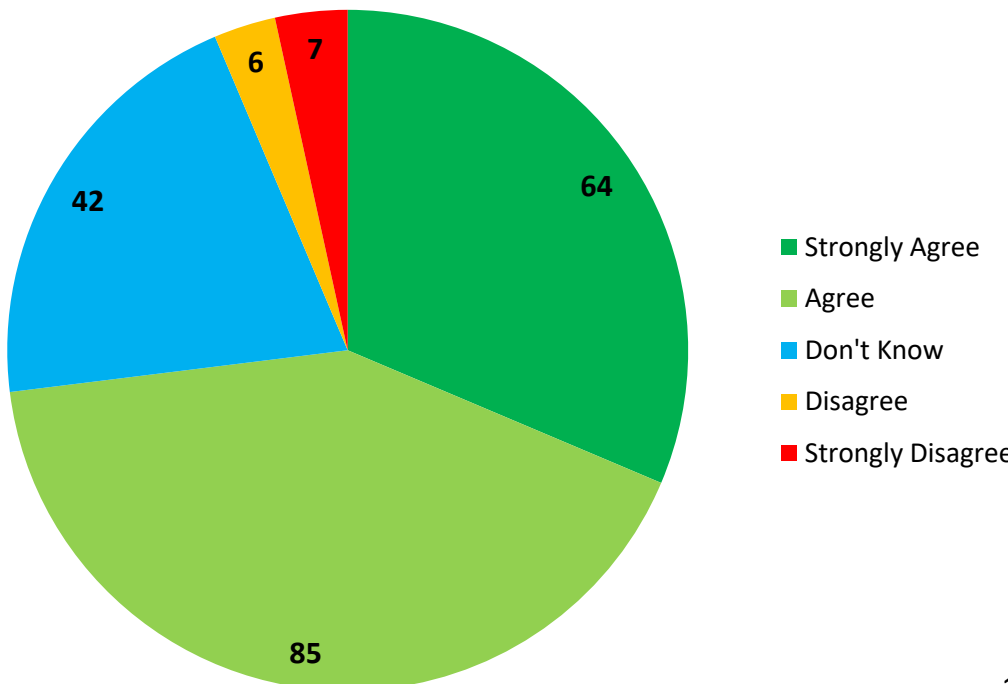
The areas parents thought the school could focus on developing were:

- Communication

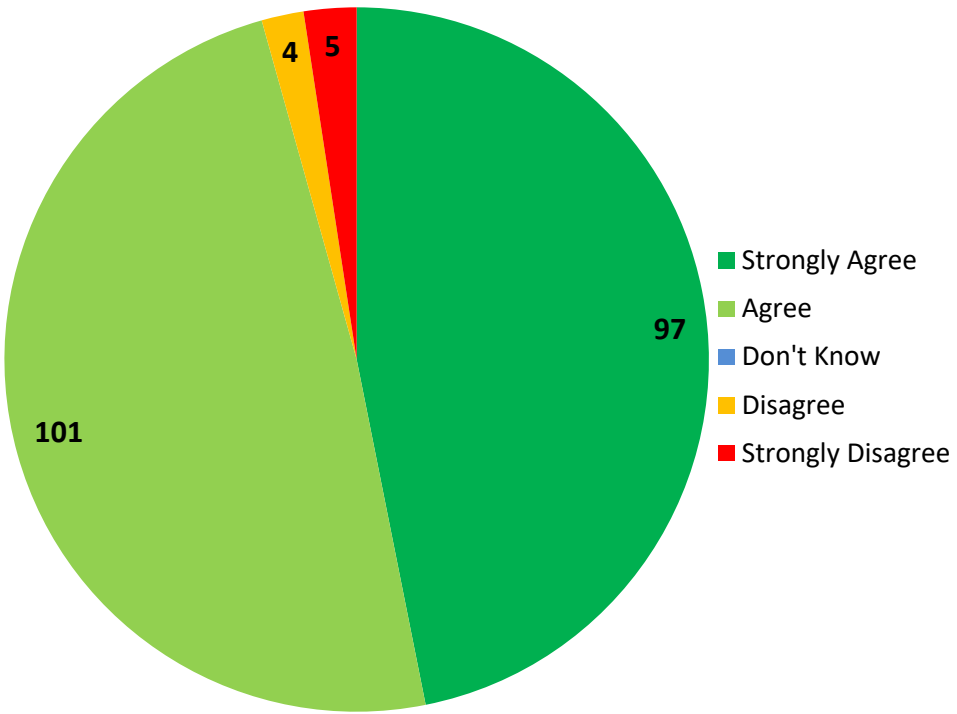

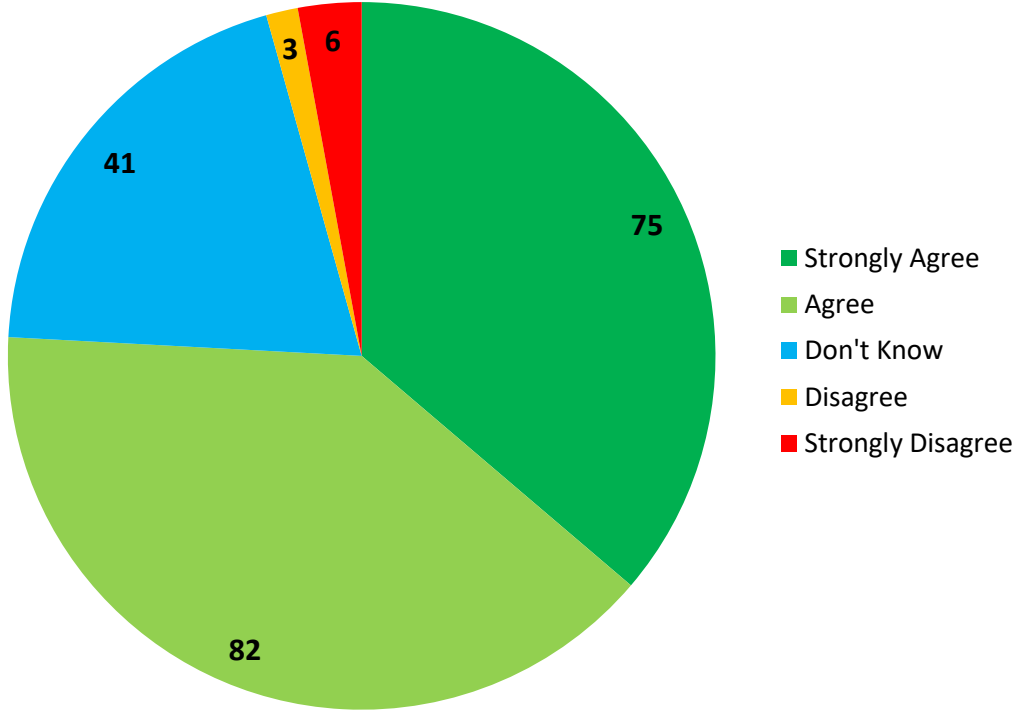
We provide opportunities for our children to work with others in the community as active citizens.



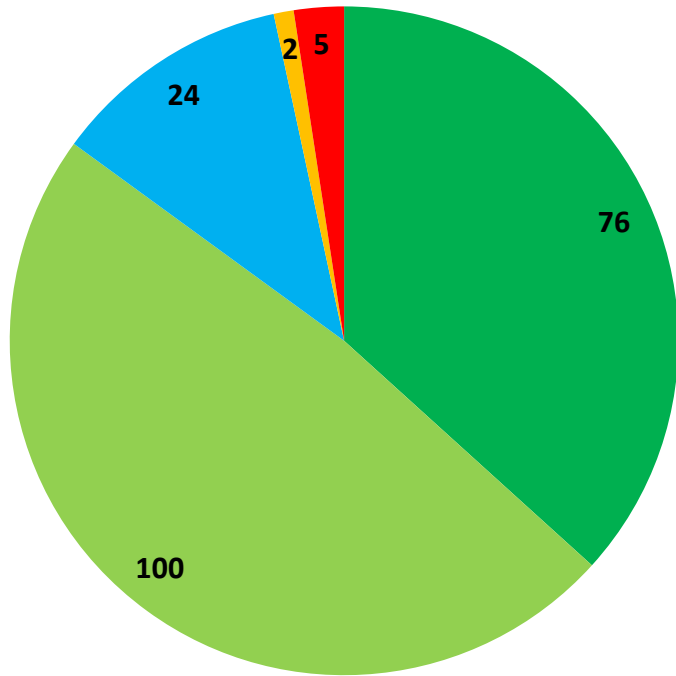
The learning, social and emotional needs of young people at Mearns Primary are being met?



Our Homework/Literacy and Numeracy kits are improving our pupils capacity to learn.

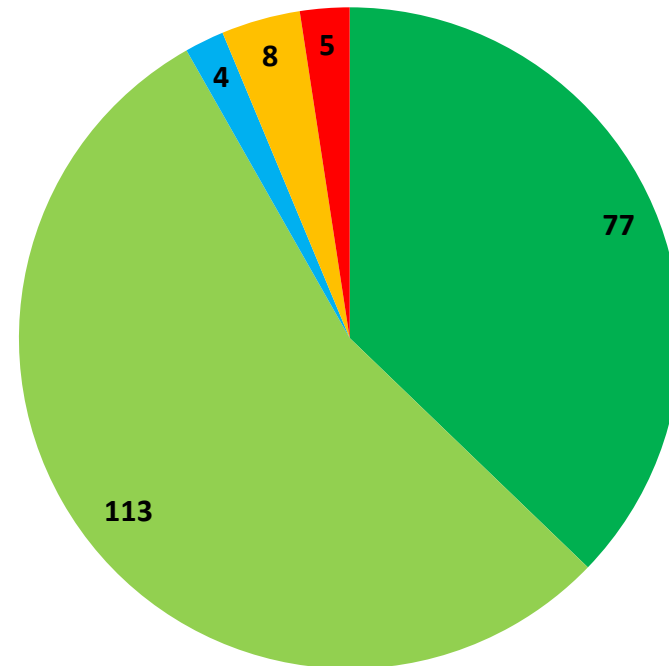


We have effective arrangements to support pupils at points of transition.
