Jewish New Year

Rosh Hashanah has a literal translation of '***beginning the year***' and lasts for two days from 29th September until the 1st October.

The biblical name for Rosh Hashanah is ***Yom Teruah***, which literally means 'day shouting or blasting'.

It commemorates the creation of the world and is also a judgement day, when people of Jewish faith believe that God balances a person's good deeds over the last year against their bad deeds, and decides what the next year will be like.
