# **Learning Journal**

Throughout your child's time at Madras Family Centre they will have their own Learning Journal. This journal will be individual to each child and will be completed by them in partnership with staff. The journal will reflect your child's interests and stage of learning. Children will lead their own learning in this journal and actively plan for their next steps. Learning journals will be sent home each term and we hope you enjoy talking through your child's learning journey with them. Parents will be invited to give their feedback and comments also.





### **Settling Sheets**

For all children who are new to Madras Family Centre settling sheets will be sent home shortly. These sheets are completed within the first 4-6 weeks of your child starting at Madras Family Centre by your child's keyworker. These will give you further information on your child, how they have settled and their interests and development within the short time they have attended the Centre. We very much value both you and your child's views and ask for your support in completing these and returning them to nursery. These will be added in to Learning Journals.

### Stay & Play

In the summer term of last year we piloted our Stay and Play sessions. These sessions invited parents into the Centre to engage in purposeful play with their own child. Parental feedback from these sessions was very positive and this term we intend to continue into our second cycle of these sessions. Further information will be available soon.

Children are encouraged to contribute to these displays by choosing and decorating their own butterfly success sheet. Please allow your child to bring in photos or certificates for our displays, and let staff know if your child achievement anv or success throughout the year. We will be taking children outdoors on a daily basis. Please ensure children have appropriate clothing to go outdoors i.e. suitable footwear and jackets/waterproof trousers. We do have a selection of waterproof clothing which you can put on your child if you forget on their outdoor day. We will always ensure that the weather does not make it unsafe for children to be outside but we will go outside in the rain, wind, snow and sun if there is not an immediate health and safety risk. All outdoor experiences are risk assessed

Children should always change their shoes into a soft pair of indoor shoes, (preferably without laces, no slippers or crocs) when they arrive at nursery unless staff advise them to keep outdoor clothing on.

Please ensure your child has a pair of wellies at nursery for everyday use.

## **Book Amnesty**

## **Nursery Fund**

We ask for your support in contributing to our nursery fund. This is £2 per week per child and this contributes towards snack, baking and a wide range of resources and curricular experiences for all children.

#### **Centre Security**

Please close all outdoor yellow gates once you have passed through them. Their purpose is to provide secure safety measures for all children. It is therefore imperative that all parent/careers ensure these are closed behind them. We thank you for your support with this.

The Family Centre has a secure entry system. Please press the buzzer for the office for the office and wait for a member of staff to answer. Please do not press playroom buzzers as staff cannot leave these to answer the door. When leaving the building please DO NOT open the door for other parent/carers. Although it may appear rude to close the door it supports our security measures by ensuring a member of staff is aware of those entering the building. For children who use our late wraparound service please press the buzzer for Room 3 after 4pm.

We appreciate that it can become quite congested at the beginning and end of sessions as parent/carers drop off and collect children. Where possible we request that older siblings wait outside. Please be patient with staff as they follow the policy and procedures for the Family Centre to ensure the safe entry and collection of children. If you require to speak with a member of staff then please make your request known at the office and we will facilitate this. Alternatively telephone us during the session to arrange to speak with a member of staff as necessary. We will provide planned opportunities for you to meet with staff to learn more about your child's progress





### **2yr Old Provision**

If your child is currently within the Family Centre utilising a 2 year old placement it is important that you still apply for their 3 year old placement. An application form can be accessed online at

#### Sign In / Out

Please make sure you sign in and sign out your child at drop off and pick up. Staff do keep individual records for fire evacuation purposes but we also require the sign in sheets to cross reference this information. Please inform a member of staff if someone else is collecting your child. If it is an unknown adult whom you are giving permission to collect your child and they are NOT on your enrolment form then they will be asked for the password which you provided.

Please inform the office of any changes in contact details so this can be changed on our system.

#### **GroupCALL**

Continuing with the theme of communication, we have recently introduced an enhanced text messaging service called GroupCALL. I would urge all of you to sign up to this service by downloading the relevant app to your smartphone. Simply search for 'Groupcall' in the app store (you should look for the app with this symbol) "Xpressions" app.



### **Primary One Registration**

If you have a child turning 5 between 1<sup>st</sup> March 2017 and 28<sup>th</sup> February 2018, they will be eligible to attend school in August 2017. To do so they must be registered between Monday 16<sup>th</sup> January and Friday 20<sup>th</sup> January 2017 between 1:45pm and 3:30pm.

A number of documents are required to be brought along as part of the application process, and it is important these are produced so that the application process runs as smoothly as possible.

Successful applications for P1 registration will be notified by East Renfrewshire Council from April onwards.

#### **School Start Times**

Please remember it is your responsibility to ensure that your child arrives on time each day to begin class with their peers.

School starts at 9:00am and we have established a soft start for P1 – P2 children from 8:50am. It is expected that all children arrive in plenty of time for the 9:00am bell which signals the start of the school day.

Arrival after this time will be recorded in your child's attendance record.

Attendance at school is vital to ensure your child reached their full potential.

School attendance and late coming is monitored regularly by the Senior Management Team. If this is something you would like to discuss please contact the school office.





#### **Keeping Safe**

Across our campus we encourage everyone to be healthy and active as much as possible. If your child chooses to cycle or scoot to school or Centre, bikes etc can be stored securely on the school/ Centre grounds.

Please leave buggies/prams at the bottom of the ramp at either the Centre or school (depending on which building you are visiting) this enables us to comply with health and safety regulations.

Please also remember that the car parks attached to the campus (school and Centre) are designated for staff only. This includes from 8:15am in the morning for those who access the MACS service. Staff arrive between 8:00 - 8:40. Having children being dropped off in the carpark and running through the carpark is not safe. Please make use of the streets and parking around the school and Centre for this - ensuring that you comply with the parking regulations.

Please avoid parking on the zig-zags at all times.

#### No Dogs

Please remember that dogs are not allowed within the perimeter of the campus grounds. This is for the safety and protection of all of our children across the campus. Dogs should not be left tied up or unattended, nor should they be carried into the school grounds.

Dog waste should be disposed of appropriately also.

#### **Lost Property**

With potential for 400 users of this campus it is vital that belongings are clearly marked with your child's name, class/group. Every item should have their name on it. This is especially important for items of uniform which all look the same.

Items of lost property are stored for short period of time before they are donate to charity. If your child loses anything please check with school/ Centre administration team as soon as possible so that you can reclaim your items. If items are clearly marked with names and classes, it is much easier for us to track down their owners.

Christmas Presents – many of you may have had a new mobile phone for Christmas if so please remember to update the school so that we can ensure communication is accurately and quickly sent to you. With 95% of school/Centre communication coming via electronic means we would also ask that you check e-mail addresses are current.
