PARENTS' EVENING

Our next Parents' evening appointments will take place during Wednesday 29th March and Thursday 30th March 2017.

Similar to the previous Parents' Evening, appointments will be made on-line via our new booking system – this allows you to choose a time that is suitable to you.

Letters will be distributed with Instructions and Login Details in the next couple of weeks. Parents with siblings can make bookings from 13th March at 5.30pm, where all other parents can make appointments from 15th March at 3.30pm (when login details come home with your child).

All appointments will close on 20th March at 22.55pm so we can collate all information.

From feedback at our last parents' evening this booking system was well received so we have brought it back for a further trial before we commit to buying into the system.

During the course of the evening there will be an opportunity for you to complete a questionnaire about your experience of the school and that of your child's.

All of this information will be used to help us plan our improvement priorities for next session.

HEALTH & WELLBEING

As many of you know there are significant health benefits to children drinking water during the school day. It keeps them hydrated and alert. With this in mind and as a health promoting school we encourage all of our children to sip water through the school day. Class teachers build this into their class routine across the day. I would encourage you all to invest in a small water bottle (the ones with a sports cap are best) and encourage your child to sip this throughout the school day.

This month – all the way up to the Easter holiday we have a focus across the school on mental wellbeing. Working in partnership with Vicky Mulholland from Relax Kids we are learning all about calming and relaxing exercises and how to self-regulate our anxiety or anger. So far the taster sessions have gone down a treat.

WORLD BOOK DAY

World Book Day this year will be on Thursday 2nd March 2017. As part of our celebration children are encouraged to dress up as their favourite character. Children can come dressed in their costume on Friday 3rd March 2017. There will be various other activities across the week as part of our World Book Day celebration. If you would be interested in

outdoor learning

We are delighted to announce that we have been working closely with Grounds for Learning and ScotPlay on further developing some of our playground areas. Soon you will be able to see the addition of some new play equipment and Outdoor learning resources being added to the school grounds.

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY

During Winter 2016 our school WiFi was enabled and we have been working hard to develop how we use ICT to enhance learning. In partnership with the SOS group we have purchased a class set of iPads for pupil use across the school. These will hopefully be arriving soon and then we can start using them across the school. We have used some of the school funds to purchase charging/sync trollies for our laptops and iPad so that we can get the best use out of them moving forward. Mr Bonnar will be leading the roll-out of the iPads across the campus with a range of new Apps to support learning.

Keeping with the theme of digital technology: Tuesday 7th February was Safer Internet Day. Activities across the week and also at our weekly assembly supported this and promotes article 17 and article 5 of the children's charter:

WAR MEMORIAL

For a while now we have been experiencing some water ingress within the main reception area (where the memorials were on display). The memorials have been removed from display temporarily in order that they are not damaged during the repair work. The issue has now been resolved externally we now are waiting to have the internal walls repaired and decorated.

Whilst the memorials are 'off the wall' we plan on having them cleaned and rehung in a new location within the school. We will re locate them to the Assembly hall. The hall is used daily by children at lunch and during their Physical Education lessons. We also chose the hall as this will enable the wider community to see them when the school is used as a polling station or they are attending one of our events.

Once we have relocated them we plan in having a celebration assembly which we hope will be led by members of the Neilston War Memorial Trust.

You will recall back in 2013 the school raised the sum of £500.00 to contribute towards the construction of the War Memorial in the Town Centre. Not only are the war memorials an important part of our community history, they also contribute to and enhance children's learning within social subjects.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

This term saw the start of our afterschool club programme.

Monday – There is a Gymnastics Club run by Miss McBride covering all stages from P1 – P7. Aim of club is to participate in 'Schools Gymfest' which is a gymnastics display competition held in Perth in May. Over the period of the club, pupils are trained in a variety of moves and techniques.

Tuesday – Active Schools run a Mini Kickers club for P1 – P3. The aim of the club is to provide pupils with an introduction to football skills and teach them about the basics of the game. The club is always a popular choice with P1 – P3. This particular block ends on the 28^{th} February.

Wednesday – Active Schools also run a Basketball club for P4 – P7. The aim of this club is to provide pupils with an opportunity to develop their basketball skills through a variety of drills and exercises. This particular block ends on the 1st March.

Thursday – There is a Netball club run by Mrs McCabe and Mrs Goudie for those pupils in P6 & P7. The club aims to provide pupils with an opportunity to further develop skills learnt in PE through a variety of drills, exercises and games.

Friday – Sports Development run a Multisports club aimed at pupils in P1 – P3. The aim of the club is to develop a variety of skills which can be adapted to cover many sports. It also helps develop pupil's motor skills. This particular block ends in a few weeks.

Action Plan

Early Years Enrolment

Applying for an Early Years place for your 3 or 4 year old child?

Applying for an East Renfrewshire council local authority nursery place

With the introduction of the Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014 all children who are three and four years old are entitled to 600 hours of free early learning and childcare in East Renfrewshire and all other local authorities.

Morning and afternoon sessions are allocated by ballot and this allocation is made for two years. Morning and afternoon sessions are allocated in equal numbers to achieve a balance of 3 and 4 year old children.

You are encouraged to register your child for a place in a local authority establishment when they reach their second birthday.

When your application is received, your child's details will be held on file until places are allocated. Applications should be received no later than the last day in February of the school year in which your child will attend Nursery e.g. applications for children who will start, at some point, in session 2017/2018 should be received by 28 February 2017. Please note, applications for session 2017/2018 which are received after this date will be treated as late and therefore these places will be allocated at a later date.

Applications for session 2017/18:

The closing date for applications for council nurseries is 28 February 2017

Applications for session 2016/17:

this closing date has now passed and all applications for council nurseries for this session received from 1 March 2016 will be treated as late.

Contexts for Learning

We have been learning all about people who help us in the family centre this block. We have talked about all the jobs people have in our community and have been lucky enough to have had a visit from a parent (Ava Coleman's mum) who is a veterinary nurse and their pet guinea pig Rosie. She talked to us about the different things she does in her job and how to look after animals. We are also learning about the world of work through role play in our construction area, hospital and veterinary surgery.

In language, we have been learning about rhyming and have been enjoying rhyming stories. We listened to Scottish music and learnt some Scottish songs and poems for Burns Day. We also celebrated Chinese New year and sampled some delicious Chinese noodles for snack. In Maths, we have been recognising and sequencing numbers to ten through various practical counting on and back activities.

Next block we will be learning about living things. As the children have been so enthusiastic about our animal visitors, we intend to continue learning about caring for animals and hoping to arrange some more visitors to the centre. Through the context of spring, we will also be learning how to grow and care for plants and plan to start developing the family centre grounds.

On the 20th of February (AM and PM) we held our ever popular Family Bookbug sessions in the Community Room. Mums, Dads, Grandparents, siblings and child-minders all attended. Our morning session was particularly busy and afternoon was also very successful. Those in attendance took part in Bookbug sessions within the playrooms. I am delighted to inform you that we are now a Parent Pay campus. As I am sure you are aware the school has been online with Parent Pay since just before Christmas and the Family Centre came on line in January. Lost Property

With potential for 400 users across the campus it is vital that belongings are clearly marked with your child's name, class/group. Every item should have their name on it. This is especially important for items of uniform which all look the same.

Items of lost property are stored for a short period of time before they are donated to charity. We don't have the capacity to store lost property indefinitely. If your child loses anything please check with the school / Centre administration team as soon as possible so that you can reclaim your items. If items are clearly marked with names and classes, it is much easier for us to track down their owners.

KEEPING SAFE

Please remember that both the school and Centre car parks within the campus are designated for staff only. This includes from 8:15am for those who access the MACS service. Staff arrive between 8:00 – 8:40. Having children being dropped off in the car park and running through the car park is not safe. Please make use of the streets and parking around the campus for this – ensuring that you comply with parking regulations.
