Talented Musicianship: As you know, Netherlee is a very musical school and many of our children have had opportunities to demonstrate their talents to a variety of audiences. At the Glasgow Music Festival our Senior Performance Choir, 'Lunch Bunch' and Symphony Orchestra performed admirably, to great acclaim! The Senior Choir came a very close second place in their competition, the 'Lunch Bunch' won their class and the Symphony Orchestra received a First Class Certificate for their performance. We are very proud of all our talented pupils who took part! Our annual Spring Concert took place on Tuesday 19th March and showcased performances from our Symphony Orchestra, 'Lunch Bunch', Percussion Ensemble, Junior and Senior Choirs and other invited musicians. P1 Spring Assembly: Our Primary One pupils were the stars of the show at their recent Spring Assembly! A packed house enjoyed a range of seasonal entertainment including spring hat parades. P1 Playground: I would like to share with you that, following my request for a new fence to be erected in our P1 playground in order to improve both the safety and enhance the appearance of this area, this work has now been completed. This helps to hide the Clarkston Road bin area which is adjacent to the P1 playground.



Dogs: For health and safety reasons dogs, with the exception of assistance dogs, should not be brought into the school grounds at any time please.



Uniform Recycling: We are delighted about the success of our school partnership with ApparelXChange which provides good quality, gently worn items of school uniform to be available to buy at very reasonable prices. Several families have used this facility already and we would encourage you to visit the next pop-up shop in the school foyer from 2.10pm - 3pm on Friday 26th April.



Bikes and Scooters: We are delighted to promote all forms of physical activity at Netherlee, however there have been a couple of times when a child or an adult has either caused, or almost caused, an accident by riding bikes and scooters in our busy playgrounds. Please help us to ensure safety for all by dismounting prior to entering the playgrounds. Thank you.



Lining Up and Playgrounds: You will appreciate that in the mornings, when teachers arrive in the playground to greet and collect their class and accompany the children into the building to begin the school day, it can be difficult for them to talk to you at this time. For this reason and to ensure the safety of all of our children, I would therefore request that all adults, who are not school staff, stand well back from the lines at this busy time. If you would like to pass on any information to the teacher or any other person, including for example, you wish your child to remain in the school at playtime and lunchtime for medical reasons, simply call or visit the school office please- staff there will be happy to pass on any information to the teacher or relevant person. You can also, of course, use the school email facility and again any messages will be passed on for you. As children should not have access to their mobile phones whilst in class, please simply contact the school office and staff will be happy to get any important messages to your child for you. Similarly, if you come to school wanting to speak to your child during intervals or lunchtimes, we would greatly appreciate it if you avoid approaching your child without speaking to a member of staff in the playground first. This is to ensure that all of our children continue to feel safe and secure in their playgrounds as they may not know who you are and some children may therefore become anxious. Thank you for your help and understanding with these safety points. I am sure that you will appreciate that we simply want to ensure that the wellbeing and safety of our pupils remains everyone's top priority at all times.



Eco Committee and Friends of Linn Park: Thank you to the many families who attended the launch of the newly-revamped wildlife trail in Linn Park on Saturday 23rd March.
