

HIGHLIGHTS FROM RECENT MEETINGS

Home Learning

In mid-January the council gathered together an analysis of common views and experiences of home learning and fed this back to the school. This was positively received. More recent school drop-in clinics continue to provide a channel of communication direct between parents and the school.

Traffic Control

A local resident has raised a concern with the local authority about the high speed of traffic along Clarkston Road at dropoff and collection times. It is noted other schools often have a 20 mile per hour limit close to school crossings and entrances. Councillor Ireland is currently liaising with the Roads department regarding this matter and the PC will continue to feedback on progress.

A number of parents have requested that school communications be extended to more than one parental email address per child. Communications will now automatically go to both sets of contact details.

School Performance

At a recent meeting Yvonne Donaldson updated the Parent Council on Netherlee's Standardised Test results in Literacy and Numeracy for P3, 5 and 7 for last year. This demonstrated that attainment has continued to improve on previous years and was well above East Renfrewshire Council average.

East Renfrewshire **Education News**

East Renfrewshire Education department have recently released a draft of their Education local improvement plan for 2021-2024. This includes planning for recovery of learning loss as a result of the impact of Covid over the next 3 years. It is

expected that schools will use the Local Improvement Plan with their own selfevaluation to identify priorities for inclusion in their own improvement plans. Local Parent Councils are invited to review and send feedback in the coming weeks.

Support through the Pandemic

Supporting Communications with Parents and Carers

This is one of our key responsibilities and we will be looking at new ways to improve our communications and encourage wider engagement and participation within our parent and carer community.



Relationship with PTA

Although we have a different focus it is important that the PTA and Parent Council work together effectively and this is something we are looking at this year and how we can leverage each other's strengths to have the best impact for our children.

Refreshing our Constitution

With the recent influx of new members and office bearers in the Parent Council it is a good time to review and update our constitution, ensuring it reflects our current remit and that our guidelines and processes are fit for purpose, such as the rules regarding membership.

Exploring viability of Improved Sports Facilities / Multi-use Sports Ground

The Parent Council will be exploring the feasibility of improving the sports facilities available to the school through development of a multi-use sports pitch in the vicinity. This will entail considering options, assessing the benefits to children and potential impacts on the local community.
