



## **“ACTIVE”ities Week Mon 24<sup>th</sup> – Thurs 27<sup>th</sup> May**

Dear Parent/Carer,

Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions, unfortunately, we will not be able to have a whole school sports day. Instead, we plan to have an “ACTIVE”ities week. The focus of the week will be on being really active, both in terms of sport/PE and also with learning in general.

Similar to our usual sports day type activities there will still be competitive events for the children to take part in. However, unfortunately, families will not be able to attend to watch this year.

### **Stage Competition**

Throughout the week, each stage will be set a daily challenge. Classes will take on these challenges and record their scores, for example number of laps of the playground in 10 minutes. Class daily scores will be combined to give an overall score for the week and a winning class from each stage will be identified. The winning classes will earn an extended break.

### **Class Competition**

This will be similar to the races at sports day, however, each class will decide on races that they can compete in – flat race, hurdles, obstacle, skipping etc. Classes within each stage will cheer on each other as they compete in their planned events.

### **Other “ACTIVE”ities**

At other times in the week, teachers will plan lessons that make the learning as ‘active’ as possible, such as practical maths, team-building activities or orienteering.

Throughout the week to add to the fun, achievement points will also be gathered in House Groupings and to make it as easy as possible for the children to participate in all these activities they will be able to wear suitable PE clothing to school each day. If possible, and only if you have one already at home, a t-shirt or similar to match their house colour, and dark (eg blue/black/grey) shorts, “joggies” or tracksuit bottoms would be great.
