HIGHLIGHTS FROM RECENT MEETINGS

School Improvement Plan

Thank you to all parents who provided their views, ideas and offers of help. Here's a quick summary of the discussions at our recent meeting.

After School Activities

Parents are keen for after school sporting activities to restart and the school confirmed that as soon as restrictions are lifted these will begin again. More details on what will be available and how to sign up will be communicated in the new term. Discussions on the feasibility of other activities such as art, drama, chess etc are ongoing with the school.

Music and Expressive Arts

It was clear from parents' feedback that music is seen as a vital part of the school and nursery curriculum with major benefits to children's wellbeing. The school is fortunate to have a dedicated music teacher and will re-establish music tuition, choir, ensemble and performances in the new term. Application for instrument tuition is now open and should be completed by 15th June. Support is available for families on low incomes.

Although the digital communications have been great, there is a strong desire for more direct communication between parents and class teachers. With the removal of restrictions parents will soon be allowed on campus again. Specific additional needs support groups will also restart in the Autumn term e.g. Dyslexia group. However, in the meantime, the school stresses that no matter is too minor so please don't hesitate to call or email the school.

Local Playing Field

Investigations continue into opportunities for improving the local playing field.

Road Safety

Following concerns about road safety on Clarkston Road the Parent Council has sent a letter to the council to lobby for a speed restriction around the school.

Teachers in all year groups conduct thorough handover meetings with the receiving teacher to ensure a smooth transition. Thankfully P7 children will be able to visit Williamwood and there are lots of fun activities planned for our final year children.

East Renfrewshire parent questionnaires will be issued shortly to gather parents' views on education.

The school has a litter drive on at the moment to help remind children to pick up their rubbish. Parents can help by reinforcing this message at home.

The school will be joining in celebrating International Music Day on 21st June when children will be invited to play their instrument at school or provide recordings of them playing at home.

Thank you to all parents and carers who completed our Parent Council survey.

The response rate was good with 188 responses overall, representing over 1/3 of the children attending the school and all year groups were well represented. The majority of respondents stated they had not previously engaged directly with the Parent Council so we were pleased to be able to reach out in this way.

We've taken on board your preferred communication methods and will continue to develop these. For example, we have now created a parent council Whatsapp cascade allowing us to reach out to all class WhatsApp groups and raise awareness of up and coming meetings.

We are also working with the school to make it easier to find parent council information on the website.

COMMUNICATION

Over half of respondents did not know how to contact the Parent Council (netherleeparentcouncil@gmail.com) or how to access minutes of meetings.

Minutes are available on the school website and meeting highlights are summarised in our regular newsletters (See page 2). We aim to make this as easy as possible to access in future.

Email remains the favourite method for direct communication both to and from the Parent Council.

Class **WhatsApp** groups and attending meetings in person were also popular.

Surveys were recognised as good for gathering parents' views.

Newsletters, Facebook and smartphone apps were preferred methods for receiving information from the parent council.

Academic Recovery and Children's Mental Health were selected by over 60% of respondents as top priorities.


Outdoor learning, sports and playground areas were also popular choices. The school has already incorporated these into their improvement plan as key areas of focus.
