

Walking and Cycling to School

The healthiest way to get to school is to walk, scoot or cycle. If your child comes to school on foot or by scooter or bicycle, then you need to make sure that your child has a cycle helmet, high visibility vest (if required) and knows the correct route to safely get to school. **Children and adults should not walk through car parks, they should use the paths around them and should only cross roads properly using traffic lights, zebra crossing, lollipop person or the Green Cross Code.**



Our safety is everybody's responsibility. If everyone uses the pavements, access roads and car parks properly then we will greatly reduce the risk of an accident.



POLICE MESSAGE



Who are we?

We are the JRSOs (Junior Road Safety Officers). At school we have formed a committee to make sure everyone knows how to stay safe on or near roads. We are not only teaching pupils about safety but parents too!

Woodfarm Pavilion

It's always busy in the Woodfarm pavilion car park so make sure you park sensibly. If the Woodfarm pavilion car park is full, then use the other car parks. Here are some examples of how to stay safe in the car:

- Always drive at 5 MPH in the car park
- Don't double park on the road
- Don't park beyond the '**NO VEHICLES BEYOND THIS POINT**' sign.

If walking please use the proper footpaths either the one next to the grass or on the other side of the fence.

Dropping off in main school car park

- Drive at 5 MPH
- Use the **drop off area but do not leave your car parked there**
- Make sure your children exit on the pavement side
- If you want to leave your car, use an available car park space.
- **"Stop, Drop, Drive" - Keep that traffic moving in our very busy school car park!**

Parking at the MUGA area (Cages)

The speed limit is 5 mph. You can park in front of the cages, only park in child/parent spaces. Leave disabled spaces for people who need them. **PLEASE don't park on the pavement or on the road or near the police cones.**

Over flow car park- far end at front of school

The maximum speed is 5 mph. Just now this car park has no lined parking spaces, until this has been dealt with we would ask you to be considerate of the other road users. **Park sensibly and safely and do not block access.**

How to report an incorrectly parked vehicle

Note down the car number plate then you could send this information to the campus police officer. You can find contact details on the school website. **Parking incorrectly might cost you a fixed penalty fine.**
