The February update...




Well the months are flying by and hopefully the worst of the weather has now passed. It is lovely to see the children playing outside and enjoying the fresh air with the brighter days. They are particularly enjoying the music played through our stereo systems provided by the PSA - busting some fabulous moves in the playgrounds - both staff and pupils!

I held the first Head Teacher drop in last month with the theme of Additional Support for learning. In the coming months, these will be scheduled for the last Thursday at 3.15pm. If you have any suggested themes please do contact the school office and I will do my best to accomodate. These events are informal drop-ins and appointment is not necessary.

You will be interested to know that the St Lukes' cluster and the St Ninian's cluster of schools have joined together to create a movie celebrating 100 years of Catholic education in Scotland. This joint-venture should be premiered in the summer term and will showcase the excellent learning and teaching in our Catholic schools. We will be looking for parental volunteers to talk about their views and experiences of everything that makes us unique as a community. Please contact me should you wish to participate.

We have a busy time ahead with World Book day coming up as well as Fair Trade fortnight and P5 curriculum event for parents in the next couple of weeks. Parents nights are on the horizon and I am in the process of getting the final maintenance matters finished with the P7 classrooms having a fresh coat of paint. Six classrooms will have the new Promethean boards installed at the beginning of March so the children will gain the benefit of this top of the range interactive whiteboard to enhance their learning and teaching experiences.

Standardised Testing



Children at Primaries 3, 5 and 7 are sitting Standardised Tests in Literacy and English and Numeracy and Mathematics. These assist in assessing children's progress and identify next steps in their learning but are only one aspect of a wide range assessments which are carried out on an on-going basis throughout the year at all stages in the school. The scores for each child, along with information about what the scores mean will be included in the end of year reports. The most important benefit of these is that the data analysis informs teacher/pupil planning to allow accurate targets for the individual pupils.

School Car Park




Reading Cafe

P6 Teamwork at the Scottish Schools tournament

Well done to the P6 teams who represented the school at the regional heats for this years P6 and P7 school's tournament. The venue was Ferguslie Park Sports Ground, Paisley on a bitterly cold day in early February.

It was apparent from kick-off that the cold weather would not deter these two teams from competing well against a variety of school teams from Renfrewshire, Inverclyde and Bute. OLM Thistle were placed in a group with three others, whilst OLM Rovers were placed in a different qualifying group. Getting into their rhythm quickly, both teams settled into controlling their passes to try to work their way up the pitch towards goal. With some great link up play from defence to midfield, both teams edged forward in search of goals. OLM Thistle didn't lose a goal all day, with a 0-0 draw, then another 0-0 draw then a 5-0 win. OLM Rovers went one better winning all their matches with an outstanding display of teamwork and composure in front of goal. Rovers have made it through to the next round, and incredibly Thistle won't be joining them this year despite not losing a goal all day.

Well done to all the pupils who were such great ambassadors for the school and supported each other as one bigger team. Congratulations from the coaches, parents and PSA to Rovers for getting through with their winning performances on the pitch, and congratulations too go to Thistle for their dogged efforts to squeeze a win in each game. We are proud of both teams. But we are most proud of the way both teams supported and encouraged each other during and after the day – a sign of great teamwork and friendship.

Primary 7 School Football Teams – SSFA Tournament

Primary 7 were pleased to enter two teams into the Scottish Schools 7-a-side Tournament this year. The first round was held at Ferguslie Park Sports Centre on 26th January 2018.

It is always an honour to represent OLM Primary School and both the Players and Coaches were excited at the prospect of taking part in the competition. All of the boys prepared well and extra training was arranged to ensure that the players were match fit - as the Tournament was taking place during our winter break.

On the day of the event there was a great deal of nervous anticipation, but the Players, proudly wearing their OLM Team Strips, left the school in good spirits having received and enjoyed the enthusiastic support of all of their classmates and fellow Primary 7 pupils.

The bus journey to Paisley was a noisy one, with all of the boys encouraging one another to play well and represent the school to the best of their ability – with no rivalry between the two teams... well, perhaps a little!

The format on the day was a series of short 12 minute matches: with one of our teams drawn to play 3 matches and the other team playing 4. It was a cold and frosty day but the sun was out and the conditions were good for an enjoyable morning of football.

Unfortunately, despite some excellent performances and some very close matches, the standard of teams competing was very high and neither of our OLM Teams were able to qualify on the day. That said, the commitment, work rate and attitude of all of the boys taking part was a credit to the school and this was commented on by the tournament organisers and other team officials on the day.

The bus journey home was a bit quieter than on the way to the Tournament...but only a little bit quieter! Although both the Players and Coaches were disappointed not to return to the school with better news, there was a real sense of achievement in simply having taken part, having done their very best and having represented the school. The positive memories of the day, despite the lack of qualifying, will stay with both the Players and Coaches for a long time to come.


Roll Back the Stone

Euro Quiz



It invites young people at the Primary 6 and 7 stages to use the Gifts of the Holy Spirit and to see how they can bear fruit in their homes, schools and parishes. It is directly connected to what young people are learning about the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Primary 7 pupils have completed all of the 'Gathering Points' and are now ready to start working on their concluding evidence for home, school and if appropriate parish. The pupils who are applying for a parish commendation have already approached their Parish Priest to ask him to sign off their Parish Commendation Sheet. The pupils who achieve the Pope Francis Faith Award will be presented with their certificate and Faith badge at the leavers' Mass in June.




Blue Planet
