



JANUARY 2019 NEWSLETTER

Welcome to our first newsletter of 2019. How time flies!! An extremely busy start to the New Year with the pantomime, class assemblies, stage mass and our whole school celebration for our national Bard. You may notice some refurbishments around the school in the coming weeks. We hope to freshen up the communal spaces with new flooring and a fresh coat of paint. In addition, I am looking to replace some windows in the main building around P1. Please bear with us whilst we undertake these tasks in an attempt to enhance the learning spaces for our pupils and staff. The P7 forum will shortly have the pupil designed 'learning pods' installed. I hope to invite you in to have a look at this development in due course. The ERC standardised testing programme commences in the coming weeks. The children of P3, P5 and P7 will complete an assessment in both literacy and english / numeracy and maths as part of their usual class timetables to ensure minimum disruption to their weekly programmes. The data gathered informs the class teachers of areas for focus in the coming months as well as areas where we can challenge our pupils further. The children should not be put under any undue pressure regarding these routine assessments and I thank you in anticipation of your support in this regard. Further information will follow in the school reports and on the school website.

Adverse Weather



In the event of severe weather conditions, Head Teachers are guided by the Education Department's Standard Circular 10b. Following an assessment of the situation, in consultation with relevant staff in the Education Department, a decision will be made on whether or not to close the school. If an emergency closure of the school is to be carried out, the following procedures will take place:

- We will contact the transport providers to ensure that the school buses and taxis will be available. If they are not, pupils will need to wait in school to be collected by parents.
- We will send a text to the main contact on your child's record.
- We will put information on the school's website about the arrangements for the closure. There will also be up to date information on ERC's Twitter page. It is really important that in any severe weather, parents and carers make every effort to regularly monitor the ERC and school websites. These websites will be regularly updated with any important information.
- At this point we will start to evacuate the school.
- Parents who arrive at the school will be greeted at the main entrance by a member of staff who will then arrange for the child/children to join them and be taken home.
- If we have not heard from parents/carers of remaining children, we will attempt to contact other emergency contacts on their record.

In very extreme circumstances, some pupils may not be able to get home and may have to remain in school beyond the school day. This situation will be discussed with parents and, with support of senior school staff and the Education Department; pupils will be accommodated in school until arrangements are put in place for their safe transport home.

When the school has been safely closed, we will liaise with the Education Department on subsequent arrangements. At the earliest opportunity, we will then carry out an assessment of the conditions for re-opening the school. Arrangements for re-opening the school will be communicated to parents via the school's website and other local media.

Should the school require to be closed for more than one day, information will be posted on the school's website and local media to allow pupils to continue their learning.

Hopefully we will not need to put these arrangements in place. However, we trust you will find the information helpful and I ask that you ensure your child/children know what arrangements you have made in the event of school closure. The janitorial staff are extremely conscientious in their attempts to keep our access routes as clear as possible from snow and ice. Last week, despite using 10 bags of the salt, there were still some icy patches so please be mindful to stay on the cleared paths to the main entrances.

School Improvement Plan: Homework



As part of our self-evaluation process each year, we speak to the staff, pupils and parents regarding the areas we should include for improvement each session. One topic which was highlighted was in relation to homework activities. Our staff have worked with the pupils and are in the process of reviewing practice in each department. The [homework policy](#) will still apply but the format has been given a bit of a facelift to address some of the issues which were highlighted. In particular the feedback specified flexibility and a more active approach. I will be interested in your feedback in due course and appreciate your support whilst we fine tune our new programmes.

Please take some time to look at the pupil display at the main building front entrance. Our pupils used "How good is OUR school?" to self-evaluate, identify our strengths and development needs. Their comments are insightful and illustrate how well they know their school and that their voice is listened to in terms of developments.

ROAD SAFETY



Unfortunately we are still having parking issues every morning in both car parks. The Junior Road Safety Officers (JRSO) plan a campaign to alert our drivers to courteous and safe behaviour within our school parking zones. New banners to highlight the correct parking zones are being costed. Pupils will be visible in the morning especially, to highlight best driving practice. Please be supportive of our attempts to minimise selfish parking and get the children to school without any serious incidents.

This term, we will be continuing our progress towards our Gold Award.

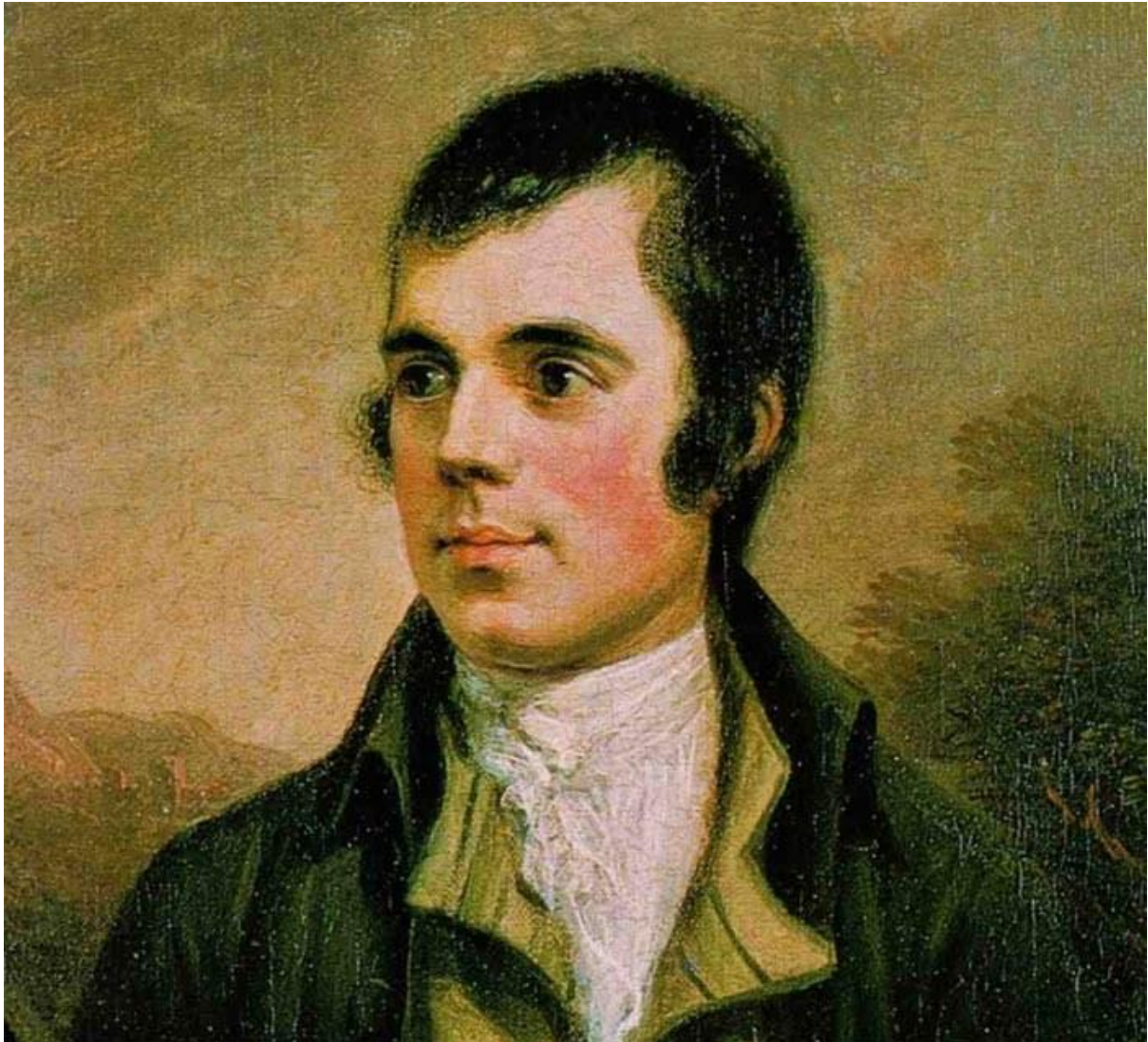
The OutRight! Campaign is continuing and we will be contacting the Secretary for the Environment to ask her what the Scottish Government is doing about air pollution.

There's a real buzz and excitement now as we await the delivery of the other pieces of furniture in the next few weeks.
