 The Pupil Council meeting was opened with the school prayer. 1. Departmental Awards Pupils agreed that awards given should not only be academic. They acknowledge that pupil badges were given as recognition in other fields. Pupils discussed possibility of reports being used to give out awards (i.e. if improvement had been shown in two or more subjects.) It was suggested that each department makes a number of nominations at the end of the year. Badges could then be given out at an awards ceremony and if more than a set amount of subjects had nominated a particular pupil then an excellence badge could be awarded. Pupils appreciated the discussion with Mr Docherty at the end of last year when he issued some subject badges. Another form of recognition could be being invited on a trip at the end of the year. 		

2. Prelims
