Mobile phone users 'wasting nearly £5bn a year'

Worth talking about ... UK mobile phone users are overpaying by a total of £5bn a year

Average user overpaying by a £195 a year because they are on contracts that offer more minutes and texts than they use.

The study conducted by Billmonitor, set up by mathematicians in Oxford, compiled the figures after analysing nearly 28,500 anonymous mobile phone bills. It discovered that in total, Britain's 33m mobile subscribers are wasting nearly £5bn a year because of the problem.

76% of people on monthly deals are paying too much, having signed up to incorrect tariffs for their usage.

In general it says that overspending falls into three categories:



52% of those on the wrong contract are on a tariff that's too large for them,

- 29% of those on the wrong contract are on too small a tariff, wasting money on "out of allowance" calls,
- 19% have the right level of inclusive minutes, but waste money by not optimising

free benefits such as data & text allowances.

Only 24% of people are "not wasting anything", according to Billmonitor, The study found that the average person spent £439 a year on their mobile phone.

Customers spent £719m a year calling premium numbers and sending premiumrate texts from their mobiles, while £502mn was spent on roaming charges.

Users also doubled their use of data in a year, surfing the web on their smartphones, and sending an average of 300 texts a month.

The most expensive movie made is Pirates of the Caribbean: At World's End (2007 USA), which had an estimated production budget of around \$300 million (then £146 million). If the budgets of films are adjusted for inflation to 2010 dollars, Pirates of the Caribbean: At World's End remains the most expensive production of all time, its \$315 million budget narrowly beating Cleopatra (1963 USA), starring Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton (both UK), which cost \$44 million (then £16 million) in 1963, the equivalent of \$310 million (£196 million) in 2010.
