#### January – March Events

- World Book Day went well, and the children all enjoyed coming to school in their pyjamas! Primary 4-7 went to the Barrhead Library to collect their free book gifted by Waterstones. They collected Primary 1-3 books on their visits!
- Thanks to the author Lindsay Littleson who came to speak with Primary 4-7
- Discovery Days have taken place for P4/5 and P5, all days were very well attended. Discovery Day
  for P3a and P3b is this Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> at 2.15pm and P7a next Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> at 2.15pm
- Peer learning visits have taken place this term with teachers sharing best practice on the teaching of writing, based on the PM writing approach which was a focus of school improvement last session.
- The relaunch of Café Kids was a success, and each Café has been very well attended. Thanks to Ms Webster and children from P5-7 for running the Café.
