Ladies Night

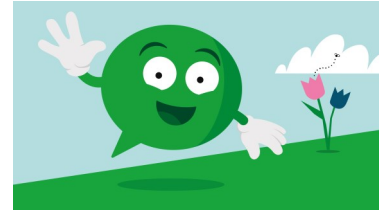

Grow £5 Challenge

"In our last year at St. Joseph's Primary School we have been working with Virgin Bank on a project called Grow £5. Virgin Bank gave each pupil £5 and we had to plan and develop a business. With the £5 we had to buy materials to make products and we sold these at our Fayre to make a profit. Our Fayre was on the 27th of March but we had to do a lot of planning before then. Grow £5 is encouraging young entrepreneurs to express their ideas and bring them to life. Throughout the project we learned a variety of skills such as teamwork, problem solving, risk taking, negotiation, creativity, communication, adaptability and leadership. We now see the importance of these skills in our daily life and think they will help when we are older and begin working. We made an outstanding profit of £962.33, we donated £100 to Missio as part of our Confirmation preparation and £100 to the Sisters at Schoenstatt. This leaves us with £762.33 for our P7 Fun Day. We are proud of our impressive ideas that led to such a great profit. We would like to thank Virgin Bank for giving us the money that helped us to develop our skills. P7 thoroughly enjoyed this experience and it was a great opportunity to learn how to manage money. "
