Curriculum Learning

Social Studies



In Term 2, we will be focusing on Social Studies through the lens of **Germany**. The children will be learning about 'people, past events and societies' of Germany, in particular, exploring the World Wars and life at this time. Learners will compare modern day life to wartime Scotland and Germany. As well as exploring the history of Germany, learners will explore the rich culture and diversity of modern day Germany, with a particular focus on art, engineering and folklore! At the beginning of our learning journey, the children came up with a few Big Questions as a class which we will allow them to direct their own learning and learn about things which interest them! By engaging in these areas, we aim to enhance pupils' global awareness and encourage them, through inquiry, to draw connections between Germany and their own experiences here in Scotland.

Literacy



In order to further explore our Social Studies topic, our class novel this term is "[The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas](#)" by John Boyne. Through exploring this example of **historical fiction**, we will discuss aspects such as discrimination, "propaganda", and the Rights of the Child, as well as literary techniques such as metaphors, recurring themes within the text and parallels with the real world. In writing, we will be working on our Writers' Craft, which means that children will be using a variety of writing techniques to make their writing engaging and interesting for their reader. We will continue to focus on accuracy in spelling and grammar, as well as proof-reading and self-editing.

Numeracy and Maths



Building on our learning from Term 1, we will continue to work on Fractions, Decimals and Percentages in a **real world context**. Learners will also explore data handling and interpretation. Through our enterprise challenge, children will be learning about **budgeting, profit and loss and overheads**, as well as developing skills such as team work, problem solving, and time management. Learners are encouraged to use **formulae** and show all working when completing written work, and should be encouraged to do this for homework tasks as well. In Mental Maths, we encourage learners to use a range of strategies to solve problems, discussing these strategies with peers.

Health and Wellbeing



In Health and Wellbeing, we will explore food safety and healthy eating. Learners will be encouraged to use this learning during their Enterprise challenge, if they choose to make and sell food products. We will also be exploring My World of Work, discussing skills and qualities needed for different professions, as well as different pathways into these jobs. This term, we will also begin to look at transitions and dealing with change.

Religious Education
